AMMAN. Aug 24: King Hussein of Jordan signalled a sharp shift in relations with trag on Wednesday, accusing Saddam Hussein of deceit and heaping abuse and suffering on the dragt people, reports AP

in a 45-minute speech on state television. King Hussein threw his weight behind Lt. Gen. Hussein Kamel al-Majid, Saddam's son-in-law and former close aide who defected to Jordan on August 8 and has called for the Iraqi leader's overthrow.

Without criticizing Saddam by name, the King's speech seemed to be a warning that he could sever ties with Iraq if it continues with policies he considers harmful to Jordan and the Arab world.

The king stopped short of severing relations with Baghand and said he will not close Jordan's border with Iraq.

Experts vesterday criticised the final draft of the Bangladesh Water and Flood Management Strategy (BWFMS), saying it hardly differed from the original version of the Flood Action Plan IFAPI and arguing that it would not benefit the na-

Three experts who had been directly or indirectly involved in the framing of the FAP giving their reactions to The Daily Star on the final draft of BWFMS, termed it as an "optical illusion", with little participation from the local implementing agencies in its formulation. The experts — Prof Ainun

Nishat, Prof Z U Chowdhury and Prof Shapan Adnan -- observed that the strategy lacked people's participa-

The final draft, an outcome of a five-year 150 million US dollars FAP studies programme consisting a total of 11 main and 15 supporting studies, was presented at a meeting on Wednesday with the Prime Minister in the

The final draft of the fiveyear strategy, requiring Tk 4.500 crore for implementation, was described by the participants in the meeting as a "comprehensive and good one which for the first time" considered the country's water and flood man-

The process of the FAP was initiated following the severe floods of 1987 and 1988 with the financial support of 15 donor countries.

Prof Ainun Nishat, a water resources expert involved in the FAP studies, expressed his doubts about the projected cost estimates and questioned the capability of the local implementation agencies.

"I feel that the cost estimates are premature, as the policy is yet to be formulated and the plans and programmes must wait till the policies and strategies are approved." he said. ' According to him, the
