When such doubts exist, Thailand's potential role as a catalyst for continued rapid growth throughout the region is diminished, the former prime minister told a recent forum.

But some diplomats and academics say the problem is more deep-seated, going back through centuries of distrust between Thailand and its neighbours.

Thailand's history of rivalry with Vietnam, for instance, precludes its ever taking an active role in Hanoi, according to Panitan Wattanayagorn, defence studies programme director at the Institute of Security and International Studies (ISIS).

"We don't know anything about Vietnam and Vietnam does not know anything about us," he also observes. "Chatichai's vision was mere wishful thinking. pipedream."

Vietnam and Thailand are the traditional rival powers in the region, regarding the neighbouring states of Lagos and Cambodia as their spheres of influence. During the Cold War, Thailand was the frontline state in the bid to stop the spread of communism in the region, particularly after Vietnam's invasion of Cambodia.


