Jordan, Israel agree to establish airlinks

AMMAN. Aug 29: Jordan and Israel agreed in principle on Monday to establish airlinks and build a joint airport on the Red Sea in a major step toward forging economic ties since signing a peace treaty last year, officials said, reports AFP.

Jordan's Crown Prince Hassan and Israeli Foreign Minister Shimon Peres held talks at a farm in the Jordan Valley, 60 kilometres (40 miles) west of Amman, to discuss a number of joint projects.

Negotiators from the two sides agreed to five flights per week between Amman airports and Israel's Ben Gurion Airport, an official close to the talks told AFP.

Jordan and Israel initiated a temporary agreement in May allowing Europe and USbound Jordanian aircraft to fly through Israeli airspace. But Israeli planes could not fly to Jordan.

The two sides also agreed to set up a common airport to serve the two Red Sea resorts of Agaba in Jordan, and Etlat in Israel
