Military chiefs meet in KL OIC nations keen

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 11: Muslim nations are keen to send arms to help Bosnian government forces defend themselves against Bosnian Serbs, officials at an international meeting said here today, reports AFP. Military chiefs and senior


