

Eyes of 12 removed in Islamia Hospital

Eves of at least 12 patients at the Islamia Eye Hospital were removed in ten days from September 1, due to "faulty" cataract operations, according to well placed sources in the hospi-

Director of the hospital, Dr Mustafizur Rahman, when contacted neither denied nor acknowledged this but said infection was the cause of removal of eyes. Explaining, he blamed weather conditions and carelessness of the patients for infection, completely ruling out any responsibility of the authorities for the loss of eyes.

He said "694 cataract opcrations were done in the hospital during July-August. In some cases eyes had to be removed due to fungal infection as there is no treatment available for them." He could not say eyes of how many pa-

75 die in Lankan military plane crash

COLOMBO, Sept 13: A transport aircraft ferrying troops to join an offensive against Tamil rebels ditched in the sea in stormy weather Wednesday, apparently killing all 75 people on board. It was the latest disaster for the small, ill-equipped air force that is expected to assume a bigger combat role in Sri Lanka's civil war.

The AN-32 which crashed off the west coast in bad weather, was one of three purchased from Ukraine in July to ferry troops and supplies to northern Sri Lanka, a region that is cut off by Tamil rebels.
