

"We are going to tell the world that we want to fight for soccer players," he said in remarks published Friday.

"There are currently 20 players who make good money while the rest get nothing - and on top of that they are treated like rubbish." the controversial Maradona said.

Maradona, 34, will return to professional soccer in two weeks after the expiry of his 15-month suspension by FIFA, the World Soccer Federation, for failing an antidope test during last year's US World Cup finals.

The former Argentine team captain has been calling for the creation of a soccer players union since 1990. He has said such a union

should help players get better salaries, participate in TV broadcast revenue and get better working conditions.

Maradona said many players, were invited and he urged them to show up for the meeting. "I will say what I think of those who choose not to attend in due course." he warned.




