MELBOURNE, Sept 20: Former Australian Test batsman Dean Jones has accepted a two-year contract to captain English county side Derbyshire. The Herald Sun newspaper reported today. report agencies.

The Herald Sun said the 34-year-old Victorian would join Derbyshire for the start of next year's County Championship.

"It's a worthwhile opportunity. Derbyshire has a pretty good attack, I reckon we might be able to be pretty competitive," Jones told the newspaper.

Cork, Ramprakash honoured

LONDON, Sept 20: England youngsters Dominic Cork and Mark Ramprakash were honoured at Lord's on Tuesday in official recognition of their achievements during the 1995 season, reports AFP.

Derbyshire all-rounder Cork, the hero of England's thrilling 2-2 Test series draw against the West Indies, finished on top of the bowling rankings.

Middlesex batsman Ramprakash, who joins Cork on England's tour of South Africa this winter, received his cheque for being top batsman.

Cork took 26 wickets in five Tests against the West Indies, including a matchwinning 7-43 on his debut at Lord's in June and a decisive hat-trick at Old Trafford in July as England fought back to level the series for a second time.

In all the 24-year-old picked up 90 first-class wickets at an average of 20 during the summer, finishing 33 points ahead of Angus Fraser in the computer ranking system.

Ramprakash, who was 26 two weeks ago, beat close friend Nasser Hussain of Essex into second place after a brilliant run of form which brought him a total of 2,258 first-class runs from 32 innings this season at an average of 77.86.

Ramprakash hit a total of 10 hundreds, including three double tons, and seven halfcenturies.
