So far, 33 member states sent their students to the institution, and in the ninth congregation today, 112 students received diploma certificates from the Prime Minister.

BARISAL, Sept 21: At least 15 students were injured two of them seriously, in a series of clashes between Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) and Chhatra League activists in the town today. The trouble first erupted

at the Barisal Government College at about noon when a procession of JCD chanted slogans against Awami League President Sheikh Hasina. Several rounds of gunshots

were fired and a dozen of homemade bombs exploded during the hour-long clash. Later, the clash spread to different parts of the town.

Of the injured, Zahidul Hasan Samar of JCD and BCL general secretary Tariqul Bin Islam were admitted to Barisal Medical College Hospital.

Responding to a question he said it was not correct that the delay in convening the summit proposed by Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia on August 15 would 'lead to loss of steam.

"The best possible time would be considered for holding the summit," he asserted

OIC's show of solidarity with the Bosnians was the decision to set up a separate action group during the recent Kuala Lumpur meet "Bosnian Assistance Mobilisation Group (BAMG). The organ has been created to deal with financial, economic and 'if necessary' defence matters.

In response to another question, the OIC Secretary General said arms "needed by the Bosnians to defend them selves would be obtained by the Bosnians themselves from traditional sources". "The Bosnians would

themselves determine the priorities in spending the funds provided to them by the OIC countries."

In reply to questions, he said "If the Bosnian Serbs are withdrawing, it is due to force and the Bosnians must be able to defend them-Dr Gabid refuted criti-

cisms that the OIC has been slow in reacting to events in Bosnia and other international situation involving the Muslim countries. "With the means at our disposal, it is not possible to achieve all the expectations within a short time."

The Secretary General said "One thing is certain that the OIC in 25 years has moved towards Islamic solidarity" and that it has been able to demonstrate solidarity with the Palestinians. Afghans and Kashmiris. Besides the OIC had been

able to set up institutions like Islamic Development Bank and the Islamic Institute of Technology in Dhaka.

Dr Gabid expressed the hope that the organisation would be able to achieve much more in the next "10 to 15 years.

Dr Gabid said the OIC has set up an office in Geneva to monitor all the negotiations that are taking place in relation to the Balkans.

Foreign Secretary Farooq Sobhan and other high officials of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs were present at the press conference.
