Weather
Moderate rain likely
A few places of Chittagong, Khulna and Barisal divisions is likely to experience moderate rain or thundershower accompanied by temporary gusty wind with moderately heavy falls over coastal districts in the next 12 hours till 6 pm today, reports UNB.
Met Office said light rain or thundershower may occur at one or two places over Dhaka and Sylhet divisions. Weather may remain mainly dry over Rajshahi Division.
Day temperature is likely to remain nearly unchanged over the country.
In its outlook for subsequent two days Met Office forecast increase in rainfall activities and giving extended outlook for another five days, weathermen predicted, clement weather at the end period.
Meanwhile, Sylhet experienced the highest 82 mm rain yesterday.
Country's highest temperature, 34.7 degrees Celsius was recorded at Madaripur and the lowest 24.2 degrees at Sylhet.

5-yr anti-AIDS project planned: JS told
The government is preparing a five-year anti-AIDS project at a cost of Tk 24 crore, Parliament was told yesterday, reports UNB.
Responding to Niam-atullah MP, Health Minister Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf said the project has been incorporated in the 1995-96 ADP for which Tk 20 lakh have been earmarked.
The minister said the government has no plan to set up hospital for AIDS patients since the virus has not yet taken a serious turn.
Chowdhury, however, said various arrangements including blood screening at the joint initiative of Bangladesh and Japan governments have also been taken up.

US professor visits IUBAT
Prof W La Maar Kopp, deputy vice president of Pennsylvania State University visited the International University of Business Agriculture and Technology (IUBAT) recently, says a press release.
