One hundred and eight army, navy and air force officers from China, India, Kenya, Malaysia, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka, Singapore, Zambia and Bangladesh are participating in the course.

Hong Kong based economic weekly The Far Eastern Economic Review has commented that in addition to claiming lives, strikes make severe damage to the economy of Bangladesh, reports BSS.

The magazine in its current issue quoted the Dhaka Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry as estimating that a general strike costs the nation 60 million US dollars a day not including losses to the agricultural sector.

It said in a report by its correspondent from Dhaka that apart from the 15-20 day long strikes each year, several half day closures are forced by political parties. It said the metropolitan chamber believed the cumulative effect is a billion dollar blow. representing 3.6 per cent of the country's gross domestic product.

The review quoted the National Economic Council headed by Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia as saying that 44 working days were lost to strike between March 1991 and January 1995, causing cumulative loss of 3.4 billion dollars.


