DATING SPOTS ?

Dhaka is on the threshold of becoming a megacity. Growing urbanisation exacts a price in the form of gradual social isolation among the dwellers caught up in the process. With the fast pace of urbanisation, the process of social isolation has intensified all the more. Yet the urge for socialization is inherent in man. Hence the citizens adopt sundry means to meet one another under varied circumstances.

The scope of finding a suitable rendezvous for social exchanges is getting in-

creasingly limited in this sprawling city. Some may disagree. They may point out the home or the office for the purpose. Here also the perspective has changed. The cooped-up accommodation coming up in large numbers in our urban life provides no longer suitable facility for that purpose. Similarly an office is mostly found unsuitable as proper meeting place. Thus the

opportunities in these respects which were easily available in the fifties and the sixties are no longer in existence. Changes have overtaken our life-style, taste and ethos.

The city itself has undergone tremendous changes. Being a city of a developing country, no city culture has yet developed for the teeming millions of its inhabitants who dominate the urban picture. No adequate provision exists for their healthy recreation. The horrendous traffic jams, the chokingly crowded public places and a chaotic public transport system are among the many ills that plague the city life. Lack of orderliness and discipline is the hallmark of this unplanned city.

Young men and women, particularly the latter of the middle class are the worst victims of the existing paucity of suitable meeting places. The city's public transport system is such a shambles that those who are compelled to use it by sheer necessity always remain worried about their own safety. They are therefore reluctant to use it as a means of going to some places to meet a friend or a relative if it involves travelling some distance.

This situation tells heavily particularly on young girls with limited financial means who are consequently forced to remain cooped up within the four walls of their house. They find the only outlet for some relief from their boredom in the TV pro

grammes. The story is, however, different with the affluent classes who have their own cars to go places of their choice as a meeting place.

There are, of course, many people, bereft of the luxury of independent transport of their own, who resort to certain alternatives as a meeting place which are an outgrowth of new developments in the urban life. One such new development is the growing number of ice-cream parlours in the city. They serve as good spots for

meeting people at reasonable cost. They are mostly popular among the young generation. Though ice-cream is yet to emerge as an integral part of our life style, many have found in the ice-cream parlours a convenient means of escaping the humdrum existence of city life with their friends and relatives. In the evenings and on sultry days they tend to be-

come overcrowded, which is their only drawback as a meeting place.

Other suitable venues for meeting people without much cost include the proliferating fast food shops. However, the number of coffee-shops which may be used for such purposes is comparatively small. At all these places, there is much overcrowding particularly in the evening which is compounded by the presence of some undesirable elements at times. This vitiates the atmosphere for free and frank talks among friends.

Cinema houses are no longer regarded as suitable meeting places, because of the presence of anti-social elements. Similar is the situation in the city's parks and open spaces. The so-called community centres are normally venues for large gatherings for the purpose of entertainment for such occasions as marriage receptions and birthday parties, etc.

The city dwellers have radically changed in their mode of life. With their exposure to new ideas through many sources - mainly through such media as cable TV, CNN, BBC, etc — their outlook has been patterned on rejection of old ideas. But the present city life has failed to keep up with the newfangled ideas of the generation of people faced with the problem of finding suitable places for social exchanges in a peaceful atmosphere.

Caution for vehicle owners

The government authorities has asked people concerned not to bring vehicles of garage without "original" fitness certificate and warned of fine for violation of the order, reports UNB.

The warning came yesterday from the Department of Environment after a weeklong mobile court since September 23 which found a huge number of vehicles emitting black smoke and using high-sound horns in Dhaka and Chittagong metropolitan cities.

Representatives from Department of Environment, Metropolitan Police, Metropolitan Magistracy and Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) took part in the court.

In Dhaka, some 564 motor vehicles were examined, of which 26 were fined a total of Tk 4,600 on charge of emitting black smoke and using high-sounding horns while cases were filed against 105 vehicles.

Examining 313 vehicles, the court realised an amount of Tk 1,950 from 25 vehicles in Chittagong city.

Black smoke is mainly caused by lack of regular servicing and maintenance of vehicles.

The smoke, containing carbon mono-oxide and poisonous sulpher and lead, may cause various complicated diseases like cancer in lurigs, tuberculosis, pneumonia and

The Department of Environment said it would regularly conduct mobile courts in all the cities and towns of the country in future to prevent air and sound pol-

Met Office said slight rise in day temperature is expected over the country.


