DU VC at a seminar Political crisis needs political solution

Prof Emajuddin Ahmed, the Vice Chancellor of the Dhaka University, yesterday said that the present crisis was a creation of the political parties, and so it should be resolved politically within the framework of the laws of the land.

The VC, presiding over a seminar entitled 'Political Crisis and the Role of Journalists' at the TSC auditorium of the university urged the journalists to be fair and objective in their reports.

Prof Emajuddin said that the journalists could play effective role in resolving the present political deadlock.

A B M Musa, an eminent journalist and columnist of the country, presented the keynote paper at the seminar organised by the Dhaka University Journalists' Association (DUJA) on the occasion of its 10th founding and

reunion ceremony. Musa in his paper said, the journalists in this situation cannot play any remarkable role firstly because they are more or less 'committed' to certain viewpoints.

Secondly, the politicians also do not seem to want any involvement of the journalists in this regard, he said.

Prof Serajul Islam Chowdhury, Editor, Bangladesh Times, Mahub Anam, Jatiya Press Club president Reazuddin Ahmed, Editor, Bangladesh Patrika, Matjur Rahman Chowdhury and Dr Ahaduzzaman Mohammad Ali of the DU Mass Communication and Journalism Department participated in the discussion.

Earlier, in the morning, the Vice Chancellor formally inaugurated the day-long programmes marking the DUJA's 10th founding anniversary.

Sagir Ahmed, the DUJA president presided over the inaugural session while Moazzem Hossain, former DUJA president and convener of the festival preparatory committee delivered the welcome address.

Prof Abdul Mannan, former Vice Chancellor of the university presided over the afternoon session. He presented gifts to the former DU correspondents of different newspapers.

Tarakalok Padak distributed

One hacked to death in city

One Joyal Abedin, 40, was hacked to death by unidentified persons in Kazla area under Demra thana in the city late Wednesday.

The body of Abedin, father of four, was found on the roof of a three-storied building.

Abedin, who resided in the ground floor of the building reportedly went to the roof top at about 8:30 pm. When the family members went there to look for him, they found Abedin lying in a pool of blood his throat cut with sharp weapon, police said.

A case was filed but none arrested in this connection till filing this report last night.

DU Mourning Day Oct 15

The Dhaka University will observe mourning day on October 15 to commemorate the tragic accident at the Jagannath Hall ten years ago in which several lives were lost, reports BSS.

A DU press release said, a meeting of the '15th October Memorial Committee' held with Vice-Chancellor Prof Emajuddin Ahmed in the chair finalised the detailed programme to observe the mourning day.

On October 15, 1985, a number of students, officials and employees of the Jagannath Hall were killed when the roof of the hall's auditorium collapsed.

The programme of the day includes hoisting of black flags on the main buildings of the Dhaka University at 6:00 am, wearing of black badges, flying the university flag at half-mast, laying of wreaths at the memorials for the dead, bringing out a mourning procession, holding of prayers at the Jagannath Hall by Hindus, Buddhists and Christians, blood donation, memorial meeting at the TSC and a cultural function.

Besides, special prayer and munajat will be offered at the mosques of the different halls and the university central mosque for the salvation of the departed souls.
