Prisoner found dead in court hajat toilet

BRAHMANBARIA, Oct 7: A detainee, accused in a woman repression case, committed suicide by hanging himself from a water pipe inside the toilet of the district Court Hajat this afternoon, court sources said, reports UNB.

The deceased, Abul Kalam, 38, was an inhabitant of Moniaundha village of Akhaura thana.

Kalam was today produced before the court from the district jail. He was then confined in the jail hajat along with other prisoners but was found missing at the time

Later, he was found dead when police on-duty broke open the door of the toilet.

Kalam's body was brought to Sadar Hospital morgue. An unnatural death case was filed with Sadar thana.

Three housewives killed in Pabna

PABNA, Oct 7: Three young housewives allegedly fell victim to cruelties of their husbands within hours in the district, official sources said today, reports UNB.

Asma Khatun, 25, died at 10 am today at village Ghonapara in Santhia thana after her husband Hasen Ali beat her up as she failed to bring him a dowry of Tk 10,000, according to allegation lodged with police.

Asma, married to Hasen, a day labourer, four years back, used to be pressed often for the dowry committed by her poor parents during marriage.

Acid was poured into the victim's mouth to prove it as a case of suicide, police said. Hasen Ali went into hiding after the incident. A UD case

was filed with Santhia thana. Another woman, 20-yearold Mahfuza Khatun, succumbed at 6 this morning to overnight beating at village Kadomdanga in Atghoria

Her husband Mohammad Monjil allegedly tortured her for failing to bring him a bi cycle from her parents as per commitment made during marriage.

Mahfuza, married a year back, was reportedly five months' pregnant. She was beaten throughout the night and thrown out of the house. according to police case.

The third victim was Anjila Khatun, 24, of village Hatail Aralia in Bera thana, who died at 10 Friday night. She had to die for denying her husband, Dayal Pramanik, permission to marry for the third time.

A case was filed with Bera thana in this connection.

The opposition wants neutral people to be in power, just prior to, and during the elections. The government wants that any solution arrived at, must be within the framework of the constitution. These points, as we had said on another occasion, are the NON-NEGOTIABLES of the two sides. PM's letter must reflect this reality, and be directed at moving forward, and not rehashing well known and hackneyed positions. Unless the above reality is reflected in the PM's letter, it will end up being rejected by the opposition,

delicate, and both sides are full of suspicion of one another, we suggest that secret discussions take place on the very draft of the PM's letter. Let one person from each side, who enjoys the leader's confidence, meet secretly and work out an acceptable draft. This will get us off to a good start.

through is made, then discussions can be held at two levels. First the authorised negotiators can work out the details, and finally the two leaders can meet to seal it at a summit level. In addition to the com-

plexity of the issues, the

question of 'saving-face' is also making a solution extremely difficult. BNP genuinely feels that the moment it agrees to a caretaker concept, the opposition will declare it to be its victory, and present it to the people as total capitulation of the ruling party! This, BNP feels, will seriously affect the party's image and the morale of its workers, culminating in the poor show in the elections. This feeling of BNP, the opposition should not ignore. Negotiations are doomed to failure if a negotiating partner is made to feel as a loser, or has the fear of being identified as such in the public mind. In negotiations, the psychological aspect, and the "face" aspect

For the sake of the country, a free and fair election, peace, and for the survival of democracy, both sides will have to agree to present the

are just as important as the

contending issues.

VICTORY OF BOTH SIDES, and not as victory of one and the capitulation of the other. In fact the fundamental spirit of negotiations is that both sides win, and none loses. It has to be a WIN-WIN situation, and not a WIN-LOSE one. Such an agreement, or understanding, may appear unrealistic. Yet we have to try. For, what is the alternative? Only more strife, chaos and bitterness jeopardising our very future.

As we have said earlier,

negotiated settlement as

time has come for both sides to be realistic. Let us stop pretending: on the government side, that everything is normal, and that the opposition's demand has no public support; and on the opposition side that this government can be changed in any way other than an election. Let us also stop pretending that we have lots of time at hand, and that government is doing a good job, or that hartals are being observed 'spontaneously.' The reality, as we understand it, is that an anger of unfathomable intensity is building up in the people, in whose mind both the government and the opposition stand equally guilty

of endangering democracy.
