'SM Sultan — larger than life'

On the occasion of the first death anniversary of SM Sultan, a discussion meet on the great artist's life and struggle was organised by the Shilpakala Academy in the city yesterday.

"Sultan — the man and the artist — was larger than life." His was a singular character and he lived the true life of an artist, Sayeed Ahmed said remembering the life and times of the renowned painter.

Held at the Academy's seminar room, the meet was addressed by playwright Sayeed Ahmed, poet Asad Chowdhury, artists Keramat Molla, Matlub Ali and Nasim Ahmed Nadi, and critic Sadeq Khan. Mobarak H Khan, Director General, and Subir Chowdhury Director, of the academy presided over and coordinated the session respectively.

His whole life was an art in itself, added Sadeq Khan. "Sultan had big dreams. And he conveyed them to us through his works — his brush strokes, his drawings of sculptured figures and huge canvases." Asad Chowdhury said in his tribute to the artist.

He always felt responsible for the underprivileged and his heart was as big as was

his canvases. Chowdhury said recalling Sultan's love for children and animals.

Sultan was greatly inspired and influenced by the War of Liberation of 1971. Keramat Molla said recalling the artist's works.

For some of his more ardent admirers, Sultan had almost attained the status of a saint, remembered Nasim Ahmed.

"People would call him 'Rishi Da' and when he played the flute, they would listen with reverence," said Ahmed.

Sultan is immortal, for art has no death and neither does an artist. Mobarak Hossain Khan said in his concluding speech.

Meanwhile, Shiksha O Sanskritik Kendra yesterday distributed gifts among the participants of a painting festival, organised for the children of Ananda Niketan in observance of Sultan's death anniversary in the auditorium of Biswa Sahitya Kendra.

Painter Hashem Khan attended the ceremony as chief guest and gave away the gifts. FR Mahmood Hasan, coordinator of the Kendra chaired the function, while Nazim Mahmood and Maleka Begum also spoke on the occasion.

Shaheed Jihad Day observed

Different student organisations yesterday observed the 5th death anniversary of Jihad with a pledge to protect the hard-earned democracy at any cost.

The organisations held separate rallies yesterday on the Dhaka University campus in observance of the Shaheed Jihad Day.

Jihad, a college student from Sirajganj district, was shot dead on October 10, 1990 during the anti-autocratic movement.

BNP backed Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) at a rally blamed AL for collaborating with the killers of Jihad which, what they said, is against the spirit of mass upsurge in '90.

Speaking as chief guest, Mir Shawkat Ali, Minister for Labour and Manpower, said the opposition is trying to jeopardise the democracy through hartal, gherao and other programmes.

Held at the Jatiya Press Club, the JCD rally vowed to protect democracy at any cost under the leadership of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia.

Addressing a rally near the Aparajeo Bangla at DU, Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) student wing of the Awami League, blamed the ruling BNP for ignoring the 10-point demands of All Party Student Unity (APSU) which was formed following the death of Jihad.

The BCL leaders termed the BNP government autocratic and pledged to oust the present government under the leadership of Sheikh Hasina.
