On October 15, 1985 at least 41 students, officials and employees of Jagannath Hall were killed when the roof of the hall auditorium jat will be offered at the collapsed while they were watching a popular drama serial on BTV.

Weather is likely to remain mainly dry with partly cloudy sky all over the country during the next 12 hours till 6 pm today, reports UNB.


Met Office said day temperature may rise slightly during the period across the country. No appreciable change is expected in the next two days.




