### Most garments factories in city lack safety measures

Twenty-five workers, including 16 women, died in a fire at Saraka Garments, Mirpur on 27 December 1990; five female workers died and at least 30 others were injured on 11 February 1995 at the Prostor Garments, Mirpur; and most recently, on 5 August, nine teenagers aged between 13-and 19 perished in the Lusaka Fashion Garments Factory. Ibrahimpur in a stampede resulting from a false fire alarm.

Garment factory owners are not taking lessons from the ever-increasing fire-related incidents, some of them fatal. Contrary to its rapid growth, the safety record of this industry has been steadily declining in Dhaka city: the consequences being tragic and alarming.

Many accidents and fire incidents in these congested. non-ventilated, ill-lit, hot and humid factories have not been reported in the press because there were no deaths. If these incidents were properly reported then a more realistic picture would have emerged of the danger that our garment unless face
