COLOMBO. Oct 21: The military claimed killing at least 106 Tamil guerillas today in fierce battles that raged following an army advance for a fifth straight day in Sri Lanka's embattled north, reports AFP.

Government troops lost four men while 18 others were wounded in the latest fighting on the northern Jaffna peninsula, the main stronghold of the rebel Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE), a military spokesman

Troops advanced two kilometers (1.2 miles) and captured Acheheulu government hospital from the LTTE, the spokesman said, adding that the medical facility was stocked with a large quantity of medicines.

Student killed in road accident

A young boy of class ten died when a Tongi-bound bus hit the rickshaw in which he was travelling in front of Railaxmi Complex at Uttara in the city Friday night.

Dhanmondi Tutorial was rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital at around midnight but he remained unattended until a doctor turned up at 5 am, says a press release. He was then declared dead.

At least 106 LTTE militants were killed and another 200 wounded in the fighting. the spokesman said.

Another report says: The Tamil Tiger guerillas today butchered at least 66 villages in three massacres in eastern Sri Lanka, military spokesman Sarath Munasinghe said.

Gunmen of the separatist Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam stormed the three villages of Bowatte, Mangalagama and Padaviya, all in the eastern province, and carried out the killings as most of the villagers slept.
