

But Jahangir's role only as a batsman surprised each and every one when he skipped his wicketkeeping job in the latter half of the match.

Earlier, the right-handed batsman was relieved from the "pool" by the Bangladesh Cricket Control Board (BCCB) following his plea that he was a wicketkeeper. Now that he is eluding his

duty, it implies that Mohammedans are violating the rule imposed by the BCCB that each team will have a maximum of four pool players. Or, did the organisers, release Jahangir to unduly favour some quarter?

When asked, the tournament committee secretary Golam Faruque Apu opted to remain silent instead of coming in defense of the issue in question.




