

## 30 hurt during Opposition's programme

At least 30 people including five policemen were injured in the capital and at Netrokona in clashes, chase and counter-chase between police and demonstrators yesterday during the Opposition's countrywide programme of gherao of the deputy commissioners' of-

The gherao programme was observed by and large peacefully elsewhere in the country with the three major opposition political parties' submitting memoranda to the deputy commissioners to press their common demand for holding general elections under a caretaker government.

The three parties -Awami League, Jatiya Party and Jamaut-e-fulami -- staged. demonstrations and gheraoed the DCs' offices as part of their almost identical 20-day agitation programmes, announced separately on October 21.

The parties observed thana headquarters gherao programmes on October 28.

In the capital, 25 people including four policemen were injured in clashes between police and Opposition activists, in Johnson Road and Bahadur Shah Park areas at around noon, following explosion of a few bombs.


