Bustling Bazaar Right in Front of Office

The occupation of roadside pavements for various purposes is an ubiquitous phenomenon in Dhaka City. This keeps at bay the helpless pedestrians who are forced to forsake the comparative safety of movement on such pavements and thrown into the hazards of vehicular traffic on the open roads. Though drives are sometimes taken by concerned authorities to deal with the obstructions, their efforts have proved futile and inconsistent.

sprouting of kutcha bazaars in areas where office complexes of government, semigovernment and other important agencies predominate. These bazars appear to conduct a roaring business mostly during the period of operation of these offices. It is not perhaps correct to designate them as

kutcha bazars, because, besides vegetables, fruits, meat and fish, a wide range of commodities required for normal living in cluding dress materials, lungis, vests. sarees and readymade garments etc are easily available at these places. One main cause of attraction of these bazars is that the numerous employees of the offices locat ed in these areas find the easy accessibility of these bazars quite a boon, because they help to meet various needs of their families in an easy manner without going through the hustle and bustle of normal bazaars. Other causes of attraction are reportedly the availability of the essentials at comparatively lower prices than those at regu-

lar markets. As a result, besides the advantage of easy shopping, this offers definite economic benefits to the employees in the lower income bracket of the offices in these areas.

During mid-day office breaks or when the offices close down in the afternoon, the crowd of shoppers at these places reach the optimum level. Because of the reported price benefits obtainable at such places. people from other areas of the city also throng here to make purchases.

The front areas of the offices of the Accountant-General and the double-phased multi-storied office complexes at Segunbagicha function as one the important venues of such kutcha bazars. They are obviously sources of hindrance to movement of both

vehicular and pedestrian traffic. But for unknown reasons they are allowed to continue and even expand. Perhaps there are invisible quarters which reap benefit from their continued existence.

Another important venue of such kutcha bazaar has lately come up on the pavements on the north side of the Bangladesh Secretariat near the Ramna Corporate Branch of the Sonali Bank. The existence of the steadily growing bazars together with the long A singular feature of the city life is the rows of taxi cabs waiting for hire at this spot lend an image of bustling activities to this location. The most prominent of such kutcha bazars can be seen along the length of the road running from the Shapla Chatter to the vicinity of the Bangladesh Bank premises at Motifheel

By evening and with the closure of the

offices, the trading activities noticeably slow down, with some of the make-shift shops still remaining open for business with the help kerosene lamps. By this time, the vendors who come from outside leave for their homes, making it sure that none else could take possession of their allotted spaces during daytime. The daily round of life of the sellers of these places goes on in this fashion with occasional interruptions caused by raids conducted by civic authori-

However the people who carry on business at these places seem to be very resilient. Since the

-Star photo means of their livelihood are involved, they take full advantage of any laxity of watchfulness on the part of the agencies concerned to stage a comeback and resume their usual business. It is more like a cat and mouse game. Some, however, allege underhand deals of some quarters with the sellers for allowing them

to continue their business at these places. Whatever be the compelling factors in the continued existence of these kutcha bazaars, the people with small means, by and large, find little ground for grievance on account of their existence, since these open air selling points offer many commodities at prices which they can afford with their limited means. This is perhaps a strong point in the popularity of these kutcha bazaars.

Some 20,000 workers of the Public Works Department (PWD) across the country observed a three-hour strike yesterday to press home their eight-point demand.

They will again observe a day-long work abstention on November 5 and if their demands are not met, they will declare their final programme through a press conference on November 12.

The Public Works Action Council began the work abstention programme on Sunday demanding cancellation of, what it terms, "mini PWD."

The other demands include regularisation of jobs and accommodation for officials and employees.

In the secretariat, lifts of all buildings remained shut off as the PWD workers abstained from their duties.

They brought out several processions in the city in the morning and held a rally in front of the Jatiya Press Club.




The computer and airconditioning systems have been jointly financed by the Japan and the Bangladesh government.


