#### 8 civilians killed in Afghan war

ISLAMABAD, Nov 8: Rockets fired by the opposition Islamic Taliban militia killed eight civilians and wounded 24 in the Afghan capital Kabul today, Kabul radio said. The government-controlled radio, monitored in Islamabad, said at least 14 rockets fired from south of Kabul had slammed into residential areas of the city, reports Reuter.

#### 25 die in Himachal bus accident

**NEW DELHI, Nov 8: About** 25 people were killed when an overcrowded bus in which they were travelling fell into a ravine in the northern Indian state of Himachal Pradesh, the Press Trust of India (PTI) said today. The accident occurred at Khaltu Nallahin Shimla district about 250 kilometres (155 miles) from here. The bus was carrying about 55 passengers, the agency said, reports AFP.
