## Fifty booters to fight for Golden Ball

PARIS, Nov 8: Fourteen non-European-eight from Latin America and six from Africa-were named Tuesday in a shortlist of 50 players from which this year's prestigious Golden Ball trophy winner will be chosen, reports Reuter.

The French soccer weekly France Football, which has conducted the annual poll of international soccer writers since 1956 to elect the trophy winner, widely known as "European-player-of-theyear," has changed its proce-

Ironically, three players not born in Europe won the award in the first 10 years of its existence-Argentines Alfredo di Stefano and Omar Sivori and Eusebio of Mozambique-but all were qualified at the time to play for a European national team.
