20 states to participate in India's business fair

NEW DELHI, Nov 11: Some 20 countries will participate in India's largest business fair to tap the country's huge consumer sector opened in line with the government's ongoing market reforms, the sponsors said here yesterday, reports AFP.

The India Trade Promotion Organisation (ITPO) said Britain, China, Gulf States, Italy, Japan, Russia, South Africa, Taiwan, Turkey and the United States are among the approximately 20 participants in the 14-day fair beginning on Tuesday.

Hundreds of private firms will also be there in a bid to identify areas for generating business and investment, said ITPO Managing Director KK Mathur at the Pragati fair grounds in downtown New

Delhi. "The fair will provide vast opportunities for on-spot business, besides, providing a major forum for national and international buyers, sellers and representatives of firms from all over the world," Mathur said.

The fair generated 220 million dollars in business last year, but the sponsors said the figure could double since this year's fair would focus on India's enormous consumer market, now open to foreign investment.

Western and European firms have flooded the Indian market with popular prod-

Y'slavia allowed to import gas from Russia

UNITED NATIONS, Nov. 11: With the onset of winter, a UN sanctions committee on Friday authorised the import by rump Yugoslavia of large quantities of natural gas, liquid petroleum gas and heating oil from Russia, reports Reuter.

This follows a previously announced agreement at Bosnia peace talks at Dayton, Ohio, between Yugoslavia and Bosma which import fuel that also flows through the pipeline passing through Yugoslavia.

Sanctions committee Chairman Ambassador Emilio Cardenas of Argentina told reporters permission had been given for the supply to Yugoslavia of just over 180 million cubic metres (6.357 billion cubic ft) of natural gas per month for two months.

It was also authorised to import 28,500 tons of heating oil a month for six months and 588 tons a month of liquid gas, also for six months.

Yugoslavia comprising Serbia and Montenegro, has been subject to mandatory UN sanctions since 1992 beause of its support for Bosnian Serbs battling the Sarajevo government.

Cardenas said the committee would continue its consideration of further natural gas imports beyond the initial two-month period.

Thailand's motor vehicle exports rise by 48 pc in 9 months

BANGKOK, Nov 11: Thailand's motor vehicle exports increased 48 per cent to 8.02 billion baht (319.1 million US dollars) in the first nine months of 1995 from the year-earlier period, the Federation of Thai Industries' Automobile Industry Club said, reports Wall Street Journal

Motorcycle exports accounted for most of the surge The federation reported a 71 per cent rise in motorcycle exports, which totalled 5.1 billion baht beween January and September Car sales by contrast rose just 21 per cent to 1.75 billion baht.

The explosive growth of motorcycle exports, however, reflected only full motorcycle parts dropped 41 per cent to 210 million baht during the first nine months of 1995.

Thailand's automobileassembly industry also grew in the first nine months of the year, the federation said the total number of vehicles assembled having risen 20 per cent to 383,830 from the same period in 1994.

Passenger-car assembly increased 10 per cent to 93,218 vehicles from 84,448 a year earlier, according to the Automobile Industry Club

China's WTO entry issue

US denies softening its demands

BEIJING. Nov 11: China and the United States ended trade talks here Friday, with Deputy US Trade Represen-tative Charlene Barshefsky denying Chinese claims that Washington had softened its demands on Beijing's WTO entry, reports AFP.

Xinhua reported Friday, that a US "road map" for China's accession to the World Trade Organisation (WTO) - presented at three days of talks this week showed "the US side is prepared to consider a transition period and phased solution for China's fulfilment of its obligations."

ready to adopt a realistic attitude on China's status as a developing country," the agency cited the document as saying, quoting Chinese Foreign Trade Minister Wu Yi as hailing Washington's new flexibility as "a positive step."

In a press conference, Barshefsky, however, denied that the road map, outlining the steps Beijing needed to take before entering the WTO, indicated a change in Washington's stance - or, specifically, that it was prepared to accept "provisional" membership for Beijing.

"This is an all-or-nothing organisation. It is a single undertaking to which all members must adhere," she said, adding "it is the totality of the package that China must adhere to at the end of the day.

The talks were the first at this level since the October summit between Chinese President Jiang Zemin and his US counterpart Bill Clinton in New York, which was seen as putting bilateral ties

back on track after months of tension following Taiwanese President Lee Teng-Hui's US wait in Jurie. Wu, who is to hold talks

this month with US Trade Representative Mickey Kantor during the Asia Pacific **Economic Cooperation forum** in Japan, said she hoped that the presidential summit would also prove to be "a turning point" in the process of China's entry into the
