

She said the government was providing with various facilities for the hill people to lead a sound life and asked the refugees to take part in ongoing development en deavours by availing the incentives.

Begum Zia made the call while visiting the Bethchari area in Khagrachhari hill district where the tribal refugees who returned home were being rehabilitated by the government

More than 5,000 families have so far returned from shelters in the eastern Tripura state of India. They

have already been rehabilitated in different parts of the district.

During her visit to the area, the Prime Minister found the returnees leading life in their rebuilt homes peacefully. They are farming, weaving clothes and their children going to schools. she witnessed.

Begum Zia visited a number of tribal homes at Betchari and talked to the family members. She enquired about their wellbeing.

The Prime Minister also addressed a spontaneous gathering of the returnees at Betchari. She said: "I am happy to see you live with honour in your native land. Living as refugee abroad is not honourable to anyone."
