## Beijing may overhaul trade regime

OSAKA, JAPAN, Nov 19: China seems to be willing to accept a US "road map" for overhauling its trade regime to enable it to join the World Trade Ofganisation (WTO), a senior US administration official said today, reports AFP.

The signal came at a meeting here on Saturday between US Trade Representative Mickey Kantor and Chinese Trade Minister Wu Yi, the official said.

Wu was "very appreciative" of the road map, the source

## DHAKA MONDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 1995 APEC reaffirms vision of free trade by 2020

OSAKA, Japan, Nov 19: Asia-Pacific leaders ended their summit today and issued a declaration reaffirming their lofty vision of free trade in the world's fastest growing region over the next quarter-century, report AFP, Reuter.

The Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) forum leaders backed their resolve with the action agenda, a free-trade blueprint that sets out how the 18 nations and territories will scrap trade and investment barriers by the year 2010 for rich members and 2020 for poorer

"At Blake Island (Seattle) we established the vision of a community of Asia-Pacific economies and at Bogor we set a number of specific goals and objectives," the declara-

"We have, with Osaka, entered the action phase in translating this vision and these goals into reality. Today we adopt the Osaka action agenda, the embodiment of

our political will, to carry through our commitment at Bogor. We will implement the action agenda with unwavering resolve".

At last year's summit in Bogor, Indonesia, APEC leaders set the goals of achieving free and open trade and investment in the region to later than 2010 for rich members and 2020 for poorer economies.

Under the action agenda, the APEC members agreed to take 135 steps in 15 trade areas by the time the next summit in the Philippines takes place.

## Five-year programme

The APEC forum announced today a five-year programme for simplifying and harmonsing customs procedures, with some measures taking effect by the end of the year.

The Osaka action agenda adopted by APEC leaders at their summit here said the was based on five

guiding principles" of facilitation, accountability, consistency, transparency and simplification.

'APEC economies will facilitate trade in the Asia-Pacific region by simplifying and harmonising customs procedures." the action agenda said.

Under the plan, APEC members agree to adopt or abide by the principles of two world customs organisation conventions, known as the harmonised commodity description and coding system convention and the Kyoto convention.

Members are supposed to harmonise tariff nomenclature under the first convention by 1996 while simplifying and harmonising customs procedures under the second by the "indicative target" date of 1998.

Principles of two World Trade Organisation (WTO) agreements on valuation and trade-related aspects of intellectual property rights are to be adopted by 2000, although further acceleration will be encouraged through technical aid.

APEC members will meanwhile adopt and support by 1999 a United Nations computer-language standard for electronic commerce.

In the area of transparency, members will have to start publicising by 1998 administrative guidelines, procedures and rulings which supplement customs laws and regulations, clear provisions for appeals have to be introduced by 2000.

With the aim of accelerating customs procedures. members will also have to introduce by 2000 advanced tariff-classification ruling system and provide facilities for temporary imports - in the case of exhibitions, for ex-

APEC economies will also "explore the possibility of introducing a frisk-management approach and applying modern electronic commerce systems to facilitate cargo clearance," the action agenda said.

The 18 members will also study the possibility of harmonising common data elements for customs processing of cargo to facilitate international trade.

### **Tariff cuts**

JAPAN said today that accelerated tariff cuts in such areas as textiles, chemicals. steel and non-ferrous metals would affect 10 billion dollar in imports, mainly from the Asia-Pacific region.

Prime Minister Tomiichi Murayama announced earlier that Japan would accelerate its Uruguay Round tariff cuts by two years including the areas of textiles, chemicals and steel.

CHINA announced today it would slash tariffs on over 4,000 "tariff lines" by 30 per cent or more next year, as part of its commitment to reduce national trade barriers under APEC.

China next year will also scrap quota, licensing "and other import control measures" on about 170 tariff lines, accounting for over 30 per cent of commodities that are not subject to import quota and licensing require-

The promises were announced at the end of the informal summit.

MALAYSIA promised to continue cutting tariffs and further liberalise its financial services in line with its commitments to the Uruguay Round and APEC forum.

The pledge was made by Prime Minister Mahathir Mohammed at the informal APEC summit here. SOUTH KOREA pledged

Sunday to liberalise foreign investment in almost all of its business areas by the end of the century and remove import tariffs on nearly 1,000 items in 15 years

The vow was made by South Korean President Kim Young-Sam at the APEC fo-The USA made no appar

ent new concession on trade liberalisation at the APEC summit beyond its existing commitments under the Uruguay round.

Leaders at the informal summit of the APEC forum had been asked to make socalled "downpayments" on lifting national trade barriers.

The measures aim a demonstrating good faith in the group's effort to achieve free trade by 2020.

## 5-point Chinese proposal

Chinese President Jiang Zemin raised a five-point proposal for smooth cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region in his speech at an informal APEC leadership meeting.
