

Third Test awaits Malik

BOBART. Nov 21: Pakistan, humbled by Australia in the current Test series, will give former captain Salim Malik a final chance to salvage his dismal tour, team manager Intikhab Alam said today, reports Reuter.

Malik, troubled by injury and poor form on tour and besieged by the media over his role in a bribery scandal, will be recalled for the third and final Test in Sydney, starting on November 30, Intikhab said.

Opener Salim Elahi, who failed twice during Pakistan's defeat by 155 runs in the second Test on Monday, will be dropped to make way for Malik, Intikhab said.

With only a handful of innings behind him this year, Malik will gain some match practice before the third Test by playing in the four-day game against Victoria, starting in Melbourne on Friday, Intikhab said.

Malik was ruled out of the second test because of a cut to his left hand. Six stitches were removed from the wound on Monday, Intikhab

Malik, who was strenuously denied the charges, was cleared by an internal inquiry in Pakistan in late October, clearing his way for selection on the current six-week tour.

Warne remains doubtful for the third Test after breaking the big toe on his left foot while betting in Australia's first innings in Hobart on Friday.

Australia captain Mark Taylor said a decision on Warne's fitness would be left to the last possible moment, adding that he would not play if there was a risk of seriously aggravating the injury.

Atherton looking ahead

PRETORIA. Nov 21: South Africa and England go into the second Test of the current tour all square after the first Test at Centurion Park was abandoned due to rain here Monday, reports AFP.

"I certainly can't remember a Test being abandoned in my time," said Ali Bacher managing director of the United Cricket Board of South Africa, after three days were washed out.

That left the England bowlers short of match practice after their batsmen had stayed at the crease for all the playing time the weather would allow.

"I felt we were in a reasonably good position," said England captain Mike Atherton, he declared with his team at 381-9 and a reasonable possibility of play after lunch on the final day.

"It's a pity about the rain," said Atherton. "It would have been good to let the bowlers have a go at them and try and get them out in 45 overs or so."

Atherton had reason to be pleased with parts of England's batting.

His own contribution of 78 was a gritty and hard won battle with South Africa's all-steam attack.

"Not a particularly pretty innings," said Atherton, "but I stuck around for a while."

Graeme Hick, who won the man of the match accolade, scored his fourth Test century and brought his side back from the brink on the first day when England were

reeling at 64-3. It left Hick with a staggering average of 103.25 for his five Test innings since being recalled earlier this year at Trent Bridge against the West Indians.

There was also the continuing good form of Wicket-keeper Jack Russell, who scored a fighting 50 not out before the rain came down on the second day.

"It doesn't really worry us," said Atherton. "I know our batsmen can handle pace, we've seen enough of it over the past few years."

Schultz, who was subject of an inquiry into the injury to his right buttock after he left the field after only three overs bowled on the second day, was not considered.

"It cut our options a bit," admitted Cronje. "But we decided to go in with five seamers and a bowler then, out for as little as we could we misread the pitch a bit. It was a mistake and we accept it."

"But it is difficult to say England held the advantage. You can't say that until both sides have batted. We might have gone out there and go 500."

Ind-NZ third one-dayer washed out

MARGAO. India, Nov 21: New Zealand suffered yet another washout on their rain-plagued tour of India when the third one-day international was abandoned without a ball being bowled today, reports Reuter.

The umpires called off the match after twice inspecting the playing area. A persistent heavy drizzle and soaked the outfield at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium in the western Indian resort city of Goa.

Ground staff made a valiant effort to mop up the water, even using two helicopters from the Indian Navy and the coastguard.

The sides are level 1-1 in the six-match series. New Zealand having won the first game by eight wickets and India taking the second by six wickets.

New Zealand coach Glenn Turner, reflecting on their rain-hit schedule said: "I don't think any visiting team must have had such a disastrous tour."

Graf to play in Aussie Open

SYDNEY. Nov 21: World number one Steffi Graf is a definite starter for January's Australian Open, setting the stage for a dream final against Monica Seles and a chance for the German to clinch a non-calendar year Grand Slam, organisers said today, reports Reuter.

Graf missed this year's Open with a hamstring injury but came back to win the remaining three Grand Slam events of 1995 — the French Open, Wimbledon and the US Open.

Warwickshire let Lara leave

LONDON. Nov 21: English county cricket champions Warwickshire released Brian Lara from his three-year contract on Monday by mutual agreement, reports Reuter.

The West Indian record-breaking batsman, who agreed the contract earlier this year, had already been released from next season by Warwickshire because of heavy international commitments in the first part of the year.

Chen's record lift

GUANGZHOU. China, Nov 21: A superb performance in the snatch section enabled Taiwanese Chen Jun-Lien to win the women's 64-kg category event comfortably today at the World Weightlifting Championships, reports Reuter.

Chen lifted 97.5 kg in the snatch to take a clear lead over her closest rival Hungarian Erzsabet Markus who managed only 92.5 kg.

Markus ended sixth overall after strong performances by Bulgaria's Gergana Kirilova, South Korea's Choi Eun-Ja and Greece's Maria Christoforidi in the clean and jerk section.

The International Weightlifting Federation favours lighter athletes when identical amounts are lifted.

Battle for Euro Cup resumes

PARIS. Nov 21: After two months of beating no-hopers, European Cup favourites Ajax and Juventus face some first class opponents in Real Madrid and Borussia Dortmund on Wednesday night, reports AFP.

This season's Champions League has laid bare the gulf in talent between Europe's elite and the rest, with the British clubs definitely among the rest.

Holders Ajax Amsterdam and Real Madrid have respectively crushed Ferencvaros 5-1 and 6-1, and have comfortably beaten Grasshoppers Zurich in their Group D Matches so far.

The Spaniards are hoping for revenge for their 1-0 defeat in Amsterdam, and will doubtless be buoyed by their victory over Spanish title chasers Atletico Madrid in last Saturday's capital derby.

Ajax coach Louis Van Gaal has to men out through injury, Brazilian defender Marcio Santos, who has achilles tendon trouble, and striker Nordin Wooter, who has a thigh strain.

Juventus have also got back to their winning ways after a poor run in the Serie A, beating Fiorentina 1-0 on Sunday.

A repeat of the previous 3-1 away victory over Dortmund in Group C would be just the ticket — preserving the Italians' 100 per cent record of four wins in four and giving them another valuable morale boost.

Striker Fabrizio Ravanelli, who missed the game against Fiorentina, remains unavailable through injury.

The bad news for Juventus is that Dortmund are on a roll that has seen them soar to the top of the Bundesliga. They romped home 4-1 against SC Karlsruhe at the weekend and are unbeaten in 11 league matches.

Though beaten only once so far, two frustrating draws has meant that Dortmund are a full seven points behind Juventus. They should never the less qualify for the quarter-finals.

The only other side with a 100 per cent record, Spartak Moscow, are clearly looking forward to their Group B game against Blackburn Rovers, who have a single point to show for their miserable campaign in Europe.

"Our main problem is switching from the icy field at our training centre to the grass pitch at Luzhnik stadium," said Spartak's head coach Leg Romantsy on Monday after his team's light practice on a snow-covered

field at their training-base in Tarasovka, some 35 kilometers north of Moscow.

"Other than that we are in good shape. All of our players are healthy and ready to play."

"I would like to think of our club as one of the premier sides in Europe, and we want to prove that on the field," said Romantsev.

Victory for Legia Warsaw against Rosenborg BK would ensure the Poles follow Spartak into the quarter-finals.

Group A is the most open of the four — just two points separate the top three sides. Only makeweights Aalborg, who replaced Dnynmo Kiev after the Ukrainians tried to bribe a referee, look to be out for the count.

Nantes, who are top on goal difference, have a difficult match away to FC Porto, coached by ex-England manager Bobby Robson, while Panathinaikos entertain the Danes.

Robson has to do without injured Polish international Grzegorz Mielcarski, and will look to the veteran Rui Barros and Domingos for goals. Domingos is top-scorer in Portugal this year with 12 goals to his name. Two other Brazilians Emerson and Aloisio are also set to take on the French champions.

Tulio again on target

RIO DE JANEIRO. Nov 21: Brazil's leading marksman Tulio struck again at the weekend, this time against the club that launched his career, to keep Botafogo top of their group in the second stage of the Brazilian Championship, reports Reuter.

Tulio's second half goal was his 19th in the competition and gave Botafogo a 1-0 win away to Goias, but the striker will miss Wednesday's game at home to Bahia after receiving a third yellow card.

Botafogo stay top of Group A and are four points ahead of defending champions Palmeiras, who beat Uniao Sao Joao 3-0, and Corinthians, who lost by the same score away to Santos. Each team has four games to play. Goias slumped to fourth in Group B.

Gremio, the South American champions, are second in Group A but have played all their games to allow them time to train for next week's match with European champions Ajax Amsterdam in Tokyo for the unofficial World Cup Championship.

The Santos game was preceded by a tribute to their former player Pele, who scored his 1,000th goal in professional soccer 26 years ago on Sunday.

During the ceremony, Pele stood in some cement to make footprints which will be placed in the pavement in front of Santo's stadium.

Pele's son Edinho, the Santos goalkeeper, made two good saves in the first half before his team took control in the second with two goals by substitute Camanducaia and one by captain Gallo.

Santos midfielder Giovanni, who Pele sees as the club's great hope for the future and is valued at 5 million dollars, set up all three goals.

The winners of Groups A and B in the second stage, in which teams from the different groups meet, qualify for the semifinals along with Cruzeiro and Fluminense, who won the two groups in the first stage.

Atlanta, Naim's ambition

GUANGZHOU. China, Nov 21: Turkish strongman Naim Suleymanoglu has given himself one more chance to become the most successful weight lifter in the history of the sport, reports AFP.

Suleymanoglu, 28, who on Sunday tied Soviet Vasilii Alexeev's record of 22 World Championships gold medals, said he would retire after the 1996 Atlanta Olympics.

"You will see me in the competitions for the last time in the United States next year," he said.

Suleymanoglu equaled Alexeev's string of 22 World Championships victories by

narrowly edging Valerious Leonidis of Greece in the 64 kg category.

In the fierce battle between the two lifters, Leonidis set a world record in the snatch, but still lost the combined title on body weight.

Suleymanoglu competed for Bulgaria until Turkey paid one million dollars for his release and Leonidis is a former Soviet.

After both lifters snatched 145 kg on their second attempts, Suleymanoglu opted to try 147.5 kg for his last lift, the world record he set at the World Championships last year.

After Suleymanoglu had successfully equalled his own record, Leonidis elected to

try 148 kg, even though only multiples of 2.5 kg can be used to decide competition rankings.

Thus despite Leonidis successful world-record attempt, the two lifters finished the snatch ties at 147.5 kg.

The battle continued in the clean and jerk, with Suleymanoglu lifting 180 kg on his first attempt.

Leonidis tried 185 kg twice, but failed both times, so with the two lifters tied with combined total of 327.5 kg, the victory went to Suleymanoglu on body weight.

Chinese women continued their dominance with a second world record on Monday.

Sainz leads

After yesterday's seven incident-packed high speed special stages of the RAC Rally, three of the top four slots are held by 555 Subaru World Rally Team drivers. Carlos Sainz led the leaderboard, 39 seconds in front of Colin McRae with Richard Burns in fourth place, just over a minute behind the Mitsubishi of Kenneth Eriksson, says a press release.



Starting with a brilliant drive through the first stage of the morning, McRae was 28 seconds faster than anyone else — opening a 44 second gap over his World Championship adversary Sainz. The retirement of overnight leader Tommi Makinen in a Mitsubishi left the Scot in first place, 27 seconds ahead of Eriksson.
