Opposition will boycott by-elections

Opposition leaders yesterday said that announcement of the schedule for by-elections will only deepen the present political crisis and made it clear that they would

boycott it, reports UNB. They also gave a cold shoulder to the Prime Minister's offer of forming an interim national government for holding election.

Giving their reaction to the announcement of the byelection schedule, leaders of the Awami League, Jatiya Party and Jamaat-e-Islami indicated that they would not only boycott the by-elections.

The Election Commission yesterday announced the schedule fixing December 15 for by-elections to 145 parliamentary seats left vacant by opposition lawmakers.

The opposition leaders thought that instead of announcing the schedule for byelections, the parliament should have been dissolved to pave the way for a neutral caretaker government to hold fresh elections.
