


"Yes, I'll play. I don't feel good but still I'll do it for the people of Boca," said Maradona, the team captain. after his first fulltraining session in 10 days.

Pakistan in shambles

But Robichaud, disturbed by a couple of line calls against him, ultimately ran out of steam and handed the match and the 700 dollars winner's cheque to Platenik with a backhand error.


