WASHINGTON, Nov 29: In the wake of the alleged fraud at the New York Office of the Daiwa Bank Ltd. top US banking regulators say they will be tightening examination procedures for foreign banks operating in the United States and considering even tougher measures. according to USIS.

"We are considering a number of initiatives that may be implemented at an administrative level, especially with respect to internal and external audit standards," said Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan, the top US banking regulator.

Greesnpan told the Senate Banking Committee November 27 that the Federal Reserve would conduct a review of the Daiwa case, the failure of Britain's barings bank earlier this year and other major international banking incidents to identify ways to improve the supervisory pro-

Thailand halts rice shipment to N Korea

BANGKOK, Nov 29: Thailand has stopped delivering rice to North Korea after it defaulted on debt repayments due this year, a commerce ministry official said yester-

North Korea's default prompted Thailand to halt shipments from July after shipping about half of 300,000 tonnes of 35 per cent white rice contracted by Pyongyang this year, the official told Reuters.

She said North Korea had problems paying for a small portion of 150,000 tonnes of A-1 broken rice that Thailand delivered under a government-to-government contract in 1993.

The 1993 contract gave a two-year credit which was due this year.

The amount needed to be repaid by North Korea was not disclosed by the official. North Korean embassy officials were not immediately available for comment.

Insurance claim from Delta Life settled

Labour and Manpower Secretary Dr., Harunur Rashid yesterday handed over a cheque for Taka one lakh as an insurance claim from Delta Life Insurance to the wife of late Belayet Hossain, a Bangladeshi worker, who died in Singapore recently, reports BSS.

This is the first case of death of a Bangladeshi worker covered by Delta Life Insurance after a compulsory insurance system for migrant workers was introduced with this company early this year. an official handout said.

Besides, providing with the insurance money, Delta Life Insurance authorities also assured the beneficiary of providing education and other facilities for the children of the deceased, the handout said

Two gas fields discovered in - Indonesia

"JAKARTA, Nov 29: Pt Caltex Pasific Indonesia (CPI), in affiliate of US based Chvron Corp. and Texaco Inc. has discovered two oil fields in the central Sumatra province of Riau, the state oil and gas company Pertamina said here yesterday, reports AFP.

The first field, called Besar, was struck last month 95 kilometres (59 miles) east of Riau's capital of Pekanbaru. Pertamina said. At a depth of around

2.220 feet (732 metres), one well in the field was producing about 3,140 barrels a day.

The other field, named Oki, was found in an area where production is shared between Pertamina and CIPI. kilometres (28 miles) northwest of Pekanbaru.

One well produced gas and oil at 272 and 60 barrels per day, respectively, while another had a daily output of 70 barrels of gas, and 1.340 barrels of oil. Pertamina said.

Ethnic minority regions in China witness rapid economic uplift

BEIJING, Nov 29: China's ethnic minority regions have witnessed the most rapid sustained economic development in history in the eight five year plan period (1991-1995), a senior official said here today, reports Xin-

The annual domestic production value in these regions reached 413.7 billion yuan (49.25 billion US dollars) last year, registering an annual increase of 11.15 per cent in the first four years, said Jiang Jiafu, Vice Minister in charge of the State Natonalities Affairs Commission

The ethnic-minority regions are the inner Mongolia, Xianjiang regions, and Qianghai. Yunnan and Guizou provinces, where ethnic minorities live in compact communities

Jiang said that these regions now have over 37,200 enterprises of various kinds run by the state, collectively owned, or invested in by individuals or foreign busi-

They include heavy manufacturing industry and raw materials provision and processing businesses paving the way for further economic development for the ethnic minority peoples, the vice

minister said. Statistics show that the annual industrial production value in these regions has been growing by 20.05 per cent a year, reaching 348.11 billion yuan last year
