

Windies arrive Down Under



SYDNEY, Dec 1: The West Indies cricket team arrived in Australia today but it was the abs-

ent Brian Lara who grabbed all the attention, with captain Richie Richardson trying to play down the star batsman's shock withdrawal, reports Reuter. On Monday Lara said he

would not be playing in a one-day triangular tournament here after being fined along with Carl Hooper. Curtly Ambrose and Kenneth Benjamin for misconduct on this year's England tour. Richardson faced a bar-

rage of reporters' questions on the highest scorer in Test cricket's future and charges of disunity in the West Indies camp. He conceded that the team had experienced some problems but played down their extent.

The captain said he had not been consulted about the punishment meted out to Lara and the three others, adding he hoped Lara would be available for selection in next year's World Cup which starts in the subcontinent on February 14.

Lara was "too valuable to the game of cricket not to play," Richardson said. Peter Short, the president

of the West Indies Cricket Board of Control (WICBC),

said earlier this week that he did not know what view the board would take on Lara taking part in the Wold Cup.

Richardson said he had

to Lara after the left-hander declared himself unavailable for the World Series Cup tournament involving the West Indies, Australia and Sri Lanka.

Asked if there were problems with team discipline, Richardson said: "There have been one or two incidents which have been dealt with and that's behind us now."

He said reports of disharmony and disunity within the West Indies camp had been exaggerated.

"Disharmony? People always seem to know more about what's going on in the inside than we do," Richardson said. "I mean obviously in every organisation now and again, you have a little bit of a difference, but I don't think

it is as bad as what people have it to be." Richardson suggested Lara's absence would have a positive effect on his team in the tournament which opens on December 15, when the

West Indies play Sri Lanka. "We are disappointed about Brian deciding not to come on this tour." Richardson said at Sydney Airport. "But we are pretty sure we are going to have to raise our game and we are looking forward to having a pretty good time."

Last week Lara was fined 10 per cent of his fees from the drawn series with England for taking leave without permission. He and three teammates were fined by the WICBC for problems during the tour of England earlier this year.

Richardson said there had been little comment from the other fined players, Benjamin, who is not in the 15man party for Australia, allrounder Hooper and opening bowler Ambrose.

Short said Lara had been unhappy about the fine and also felt very tired. "Certainly he is very tired and felt a lot of pressure both on the field and off it," Short added.
