

Cost-effective technology for stronger, safer houses evolved

Researchers have developed a new and cost-effective technology to build stronger and safer houses for the rural

Such houses would be built with pre-built concrete pillars and posts which are hollow from inside and one inch thick concrete slabs. which can sustain the challenge of unfriendly whether condition and demand of the rural poor, said Mohibul Majid, a renowned engineer of

With the help of this technology, the Grameen Bank took up an experimental project of constructing houses on homestead land of four female members from May 1994, in Gazipur.

At the experimental level the cost for one such house with 180 square feet area

came at Taka 25,740 The cost however, will go down marginally when the technology is popularised, he said.

The idea is to introduce low cost houses by utilising the commonly available materials ensuring maximum safety, instead of traditional bamboo, timber, bamboo fencing and CI roofing by engaging poor village women, he added.

According to a comparative analysis of low cost housing projects, most of the firms are applying the traditional method mostly using CI roofing and bamboo fenc-

The study also found that most of the houses are built on temporary basis. The housing materials were found to be not very durable and were unsafe.

Over 20 per cent of the houses use mud wall and over 65 per cent use bamboo. reeds or leaves for wall in rural Bangladesh. It is also common to find weak wall materials such as thatching grass and stick. These material are also used in combination with mud plaster, it pointed out.

During the storms and floods, houses built in traditional method become the worst victims and the corrugated iron sheets used in these houses fly like a sheet of paper and cut all living things into ghastly dead. Majid pointed out.

People indegenised the technology to meet the demand of the locals elsewhere in the world said Majid adding, Japan coped with its earthquakes by not attempting to reduce their incidence but by going for quake proof housing - with RCC piles going deep into the earth and all the walls made of paper.

BSRS earns Tk 6.03 cr profit in '94-95 FY

Bangladesh Shilpa Rin Sangstha (BSRS) has earned a net profit of Taka 6.03 crore during financial year 1994-95 which is 200 per cent higher compared to the net profit earned during the previous financial year, reports BSS.

This was revealed at the meeting of the Board of Directors of BSRS held yesterday at its head office with ANM Yusuf, Chairman, BSRS Board of Directors and Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister's office.

The meeting was also informed that during financial year 1994-95 BSRS recovered from its projects a total of Taka 52 crore which is highest ever recovery by the Sangstha in a single financial

year since inception. The Sangstha has obtained formal permission of the government to operate as a fulfledged Development Financing Institution (DFI) by resuming its lending to new industrial projects and start commercial banking operation as well and lending to new projects.



In a statement he said that with the withdrawal of this restriction jute-growers would get remunerative price as well as the exporters of raw jute would be able to sell their raw jute all over the world at the competitive price.

In this regard, he mentioned that a vested circle was trying to re-impose the restriction on raw jute export from Bangladesh.

He said such a restriction during 1984-85 had caused serious damage to the several hundred traders and exporters of raw jute.

Some of them were compelled to go out of the trade and indebted to the bank and still bearing consequences, BJA chairman maintained.

Prof Anisur Rahman, former President of Bangladesh Economic Association, has called upon the economists of the country to conduct an independent analysis of the losses due to negative factors in our society like terrorism. bribery, harassment, toll collection etc.

"There has been a sharp rise in these activities over the very nose of the law-enforcing agencies," he said on Tuesday at the concluding session of the one-day seminar on the 'current macroeconomic and sectoral trends in the Bangladesh economy. held at the Conference Room of the Bangladesh Agricultural Research Council.

Underscoring the need for becoming increasingly associated with the people of the society he said, if they do not consider this serious trend from economic point of view. economists of the country would completely isolate themselves from the society.

"We are speaking of the national growth in our country being 5 or 6 per cent but if we can collect the figure of losses due to mastani culture. it will probably be seen that there is no growth at all. Anisur Rahman told the seminar which was presided over by Professor Wahiduddin Mahmud.
