Two killed in road accidents

An auto-rickshaw passenger received first degree burns and died on the way to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) when a speeding truck knocked the vehicle near Siddhirganj under Narayangani district yesterday morning.

Two unidentified men were also injured in the incident and were under treatment at the DMCH, hospital sources said.

Sources added that the auto-rickshaw which was coming from Mawa was hit from behind by a speeding truck (Dhaka Metro Da 2636) at Ikoria at about 7:25 am yesterday.

After the accident the auto-rickshaw caught fire and the three passengers received severe burn injuries.

The fire service personnel rushed to the spot and brought the fire under contrel. The unidentified victim was about 30.

Meanwhile, in another road accident a pedestrian was killed when a speeding auto-rickshaw ran over him at Navy Gate near Banani in

the city yesterday afternoon. The victim, who was yet to be identified, was declared dead at the DMCH.

mission officials said about 30 youths who came from a passing procession attacked the EC office and blasted cocktails outside it before going up to the top floor. They allegedly set fire to the records and furniture by pouring petrol carried in a container, police and EC officials said.

Fire-fighting personnel rushed to the spot, but the fire was put out by the people who came from the surrounding residential buildings, fire brigade sources

Hundreds of people from the surrounding areas thronged the spot when the EC office was set ablaze by the armed activists who hurriedly fled from the scene before arrival of a large contingent of police, accompanied by BDR. The EC office was unguarded before the at-

Police said none was arrested so far in connection with the incident but efforts were on to nab the activists responsible. Investigation was on to find out the political identity of those activists, police said.

The Election Commission office filed a case with Kotwali thana yesterday evening without mentioning name of any activists or political party, Kotwali police said. However, local BNP bla-

med the activists of Awami League and Chhatra League for the incident but the AL and BCL denied it.

The EC office was placed under police guard after the incident.

In the capital, sporadic cracker explosions, burning and damaging of vehicles, chase and counter chase between pro-hartal activists and police marked the first day of the hartal.

All modes of transports excepting rickshaws stayed off the roads. Though the hartal callers exempted rickshaws from the hartal from 5 pm to 5 am, rickshaws in small number started plying since the morning. The movement of rickshaws increased with every passing hour.

Shops and private business houses remained closed. Many garments factories were, however, seen operating as usual.

At least four rickshaws were set on fire and an autorickshaw was damaged by pro-hartal pickets in Gulistan and Mohakhali areas. Mafizur Rahman, a rickshawpuller, whose vehicle was burnt, received burn injury while trying to put out the fire.

Kavita, 6, and her eightmonth old brother Bijoy were injured when pickets exploded cocktails at Kellar Mor at Lalbagh. They were admitted to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

Abul Hussain, a traffic sergeant, received injuries in his right hand when a bomb went off near Baby Icecream Factory at Lalbagh at about 1:30 pm, said police. He was rushed to the Police Hospital.

At Palashi crossing, police resorted to lathi charge and lobbed tear gas shells to disperse a group of agitating workers of the AL-backed Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL). One BCL worker, Dollar, was injured. There were also chase and

counter-chase between police and JP activists at Mohakhali at around 11 am, after a rickshaw was set ablaze there. Police picked up three activists from the spot. Railway communication

was disrupted due to the hartal. Four inter-city trains which left Kamalapur station in the city could not reach their destinations as those were stopped by pickets at various places.

Afazuddin, driver and Abul Hussain, fireman Mymensingh-bound inter-city train - Isha Khan - were injured when it came under attack by a mob at Banani. The mob threw stones and brick bats, said eyewitnesses. Both of them were sent to the Railway Hospital for treat-

ment. A news agency report said, train communication was affected in Lalmonirhat, Parbatipur and Dinajpur sections as pickets put up barricades.

Movement of trains in Dhaka-Chittagong route was also disrupted as pro-hartal activists put up barricades at various places. In Khulna, train services were rescheduled.

Operation of river transports was almost normal, said witnesses.
