## Nation mourns for martyred intellectuals today

The nation today pays homage to the celebrated sons of the soil who were brutally murdered by the Pakistani Occupation Forces in a plan to cripple the country intellectually on the eve of Bangladesh's emergence in 1971.

The streets of Dhaka will carry the bare-feet mourners this morning to the sites at Rayerbazar and Mirpur where the country's leading intellectuals were massacred.

A group of Bengalis collaborated with the Pakistani forces in their planned murders of university teachers. journalists, doctors, engineers, writers, musicians and film makers who were rounded up from their residences on the nights of December 14 and December 15.

They were tortured at different concentration camps and eventually butchered at Rayerbazar and Mirpur.

Their decapitated bodies, still with their hands tied behind and blindfolded, were identified later by their rela-

The intellectuals whose sacrifice ushered the new dawn of the country's independence include: Professor GC Dev. Prof Munir Chowdhury, Dr Fazle Rabbi, Dr Jotirmoy Guha Thakurta. journalists Sirajuddin Hossain. Nizamuddin Ahmed, Syed Nazmul Huq, Shahidullah Kaiser, ASM Rashidul Hasan, lyricist Altaf Mahmud, Dr Aleem Chowdhury, writer Selina Parveen, Dr Muhammad Murtaza, Prof Anwar Pasha, ANM Golam Mustafa, Dr Muhammad Shafi and Khandaker Abu Taleb.



## I'm in a very tough situation: CEC

Chief Election Commissioner Justice A K M Sadeque yesterday hoped that the political parties would reach a consensus to end the present political crisis for holding a peaceful election in the country, reports UNB.

"If everybody resist the election, then how shall I do it," the CEC said during an interview with Bangladesh Television, telecast yesterday evening.

Justice Sadeque, expressing his agony about the present political situation, said: "I'm in a very tough situation. What can I do? I'll have to fulfil my constitutional obligation. I have taken oath to go by the Constitution."

"The date for general elec-

tion cannot go beyond February 21," he said adding that the Election Commission can, however, defer the polls date from January 18 if the political parties agree. "There is no constitutional bar to hold election during the Ramadan."

The CEC said that he would maintain neutrality at any cost. "If I think that it will be of no use to hold this office, I'll quit."

He added: "It is easy to vacate the office whenever like, but it is difficult to remove me. I've been appointed for five years. I've no fear, nor temptation." ... Asked about the Opposi-

## 'Food output major variable in managing forex reserves By Govinda Shil

the country as a major variable in the management of foreign exchange reserves since agriculture is prone to climatic changes, IMF Resident Representative in Bangladesh Jan Bove has said.

"The government should also keep in mind that holding foreign exchange reserves abroad is not productive and also involves costs. The reserves could have been otherwise used, for example, for domestic productive purposes." Jan Bove said in an interview with The Daily Star yesterday.

During the last couple of months, food imports increased substantially to meet the country's requirement change reserves. The IMF Representative

said Bangladesh Bank and other government institutions may need to intervene in the ongoing policies to re-
