

In a recent anthropological study on prostitution conducted jointly by Prof Zarina Rahman Khan and Prof Helaluddin Khan Arfeen of the Dhaka University observed that prostitution is a highly stigmatised profession which creates opportunities for their exploitation and deprivation from services and rights as citizen of the state. The samples of the study

were collected from border areas, semi-urban localities and commercial towns. Besides, posh areas of the capital and the streets, where the business goes on in full swing, were also included. The study had a sample of 1479 persons working at var ious brothels and as floating prostitutes.

Interestingly enough. these women who form not only a significant part of the female population but also are engaged in an economic ac tivity involving substantial volumes of money transaction, have been kept out of the census, reveals the study. It has been learnt that the

brothels are well organised units which operate through the combined control of for mal and informal functionar ies such as police, managers. agents, mastans, sardarnis
