

Taking part in discussion. members of FBCCI applauded the activities of the chamber over the last year towards securing an enabling environment for business and different issues relating to trade and commerce.

3. Use of government media by any minister in the electioneering after announcement of the schedule or use of government officers or employees or transports by the minister.

4. Overlapping of the posters, leaflets and handbills of the opponents.

5. Erecting election camp in a public place or places of normal movement of the people or supply of food and drinks to the voters.

6. US of government's dakbanglow, rest house, circuit house and any government office by any political party as its nominee's electioneering place.

7. Use of foreign paper or paper other than specified 12x10 inches of black and white posters.

8. Use of more then three mikes in a particular constituency or use of mike in any other time except from 2

pm to 8 pm. 9. Damage of land or per-

sonal property of any person, or damage of any movable or immovable property or breach of peace by disorderly activities.

10. Wall-writing for the purpose of electioneering. 11. Use of motor cycles of any other transports within the boundary of the polling centre, carrying of firearms or illegal interference by any powerful quarter in the elec-

tioneering. 12. Procession of bus, truck or of any other transport or torch procession in favour of any candidate, and

13. Use of arms, money and musclepower and local power to tarnish or influence the elections.

The Election Commission hoped that the quarters concerned would refrain from committing these irregularities and abide by the set guidelines. It has also asked the people to lodge complaints before the electoral enquiry committees in case of violation of these rules.

John Major was also believed to favour a divorce, 14 years after the world believed it was watching the fairytale wedding of the century.

The queen has sent Charles and Diana each a letter explaining her view and expressing 'anger and frustration' over their publicly aired disagreements, the newspaper said.

According to the Sun. there is concern at the palace over damage to the monarchy and to the welfare of Princes William and Harry as a result of their parents' public disagreements.

While Charles, 47, was said to agree with his mother, Diana's reaction was harder to guage. 'She was devastated that such private arrangements have been made public,' a friend of the Princess was quoted as saying in Thursday's Daily Mail.

The friend told the Mail's royal reporter, who is known to be a close past confident of Diana, that the Princes feared for the effect of the news on

her two sons. Heralding its 'royal scoop of the year, the Sun said Charles was determined to assume the throne but had resigned himself to the fact that public opinion would never let him marry the love of his life, old flame Camilla

'He has a sense of duty and that's all he's concerned about,' a friend of Charles was quoted as saying. The couple separated in

Parker Bowles.

December 1992, six months after publication of a book by Andrew Morton that said Diana was desperately unhappy in the marriage and believed Charles had a long-term affair with Camilla Parker Bowles. In an interview broadcast

in June 1994, Charles acknowledged he had been unfaithful, but only after the marriage had broken down irretrievably, 'us both having tried.' Interviewer Jonathan Dimbleby later identified the other woman as Mrs Parker Bowles. In her own TV interview

last month, Diana also admitted to having an affair with Maj James Hewitt.

Only senior courtiers and Major were told of the Queen's decision to inter-

vene, according to unidentified 'Whitehall sources' quoted by The Sun.

Among the Queen's other three children, Princess Anne has divorced and remarried, Prince Andrew is separated from his wife the Duchess of York, the former Sarah Ferguson, and Prince Edward is unmarried.

Anne, 45, married army Capt. Mark Phillips in November 1973. They have a son, Peter, 18, and a daughter, Zara, 14. Anne and Phillips divorced in April 1992, 2 1/2 years after separating, and Anne married her second husband, navy Cmdr. Timothy Laurence, in December 1992.

Andrew, 35, married Sarah Ferguson in July 1986. They have two daughters. Beatrice, 7, and Eugenie, 5. Andrew and his wife separated in March 1991.

Newspaper have been abuzz with recent speculation that Edward, 31 and his girlfriend Sophie Rhys Jones are about to get engaged to be married. But so far there has been no announcement from Buckingham Palace.
