

resignation, FAI president Louis Kilcoyne said he (Charlton) had steered Ireland to "levels of success

never before achieved."

Kilcovne said that the people of Ireland in general owed Charlton a huge debt of gratitude for all he had done for football and the country

over the past 10 years.He has helped to expand the game into every corner of Ireland in a way which could hardly have been

predicted 10 years ago. The success of the team under Jack has raised the morale and self-esteem of the whole nation, including the many thousands of Irish people living abroad."

Kilcoyne described Charlton as "a manager in a milion."

Chariton led his adopted country to unprecedented success in his nine-year

Ireland reached the World Cup quarter finals in 1990, qualified for the finals again the 1994 and also qualified for the 1988 European Championships.

They lost only 17 games of the 93 played while Charlton was at the helm.

The last of those defeats was by the Netherlands in a European Championship play-off at Anfield on December 13.

Charlton made it clear afterwards that he would make no immediate decision on his futures.

But pressure mounted on him. With dates for Ireland's World Cup qualifiers due to be finalised next month it was widely understood that a majority of FAI officials were anxious to install as new man by then.

Kilcoyne said on Thursday that the FAI would immediately begin their search for a new manager.

MADRAS, Dec 22: Disappointment was the driving force for Bangladeshi athletes in the seventh SAF Games on the third day of the meet here on Thursday and our aspiring footballers were the last to join the dismal bandwagon late in the day when they were forced to settle for a goalless draw with the lowly Maldivians in their opening game at the Nehru Stadium.

The outcome of the encounter revived the living nightmare of Bangladesh's bizarre show in the sixth SAF Games, held two years back in Dhaka, when our booters produced the same result at the same stage and, incidentally, against the same opponents - a stepping stone for our eventual fate of placing

sixth out of six teams. The presence of illustrious German coach Otto Pfister, who has been grooming the national outfit for four months now, full-throated cheers from a hundred or so Bangladeshi youths studying in Madras and yet another attractive display by the players all went down the drain as the strikers failed to find the net in the 90 minutes of

high-voltage drama. In a very enterprising encounter the welcome revelation for Pfister's boys was that they produced a rhythmic brand of soccer against the fast improving islanders. After getting off to a snailpaced start, midfielders Arman and Zakir, who featured in Pfister's selection for the first time, brought life to the game with some threatening moves down the middle.


