Prime Minister Tansu Ciller was hoping voters would endorse her centerright True Path party for parliament despite a painful austerity programme which has so far failed to improve the economy.

But attention both domes tically and abroad was going to opinion polls which said the pro-Islamic Welfare party - which is determined to pull Turkey out of its western orbit - could wind up the biggest vote-getter.


