Tk 1500 cr Indian sarees smuggled every year

Bangladeshi saree manufacturers have claimed that over six crore pieces of Indian sarees worth Tk 1.500 crore are being smuggled annually, posing a serious threat to the domestic industry, reports UNB.

"Ninety per cent of weaving units, printing factories and enterprises engaged in the business of local sarees are on the verge of closure." M Kaikobad Bhuiyan, convenor of Bangladesh Bastrashilpa Sangram Parishad, an action committee of saree manufacturers, said yester-


