Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia will lay the foundation stone of the Kendua-Brahmankhali Bridge at Kendua ferry ghat in Rupganj thana of Narayanganj district this afternoon.

She will also give a start to the construction of a 6.50kilometre road from Chanpara on the Dhaka-Narsingdi highway to Purbachal New Town at Yusufganj.

The cost of the bridgeand-road project has been estimated about Tk 76.33 crore. The 350-metre-long bridge will cost Tk 3.50 The construction

Elizabeth II. Diana and Charles separated in 1992 after 11 years of marriage. The queen wrote them in December urging divorce soon. Charles agreed but Diana has made no reported reply to the queen.

In a television interview Nov 20. Diana blamed Charles' mistress Camilla Parker Bowles for the marriage breakdown, acknowledged an extra-marital affair of her own and said she wanted a post as a roving good-will envoy for Britain. Prime Minister John Ma-

jor said Saturday Diana must maintain a role in public life. "It needs to be a dignified role and a worthwhile role and we will need to examine with the Princess of Wales precisely what that should be,' he said in a BBC radio interview. He said details would be worked out between Diana, the royal family and the

government. The Daily Mirror said Diana has told friends and advisers in calls to London from the Caribbean, where she is vacationing: "I realise now that a divorce is inevitable. No one can stand up to the queen for ever. But I have made it clear that the divorce
