
22 arms recovered

She will also contest the polls from Feni-1 which she finally represented in the 5th Parliament after returning from five seats in the 1991 elections.

Negotiators of the ruling BNP and the major opposition parties are likely to resume their back-stage parleys shortly for reaching a consensus on the proposed advisory council for holding the next general elections, sources involved in the negotiation process said.

Asked about BNP's latest position. Information and Commerce Minister M Shamsul Islam said yesterday evening that they were still firm on their proposal for an advisory council under the President. The proposal was made on Sunday at the talks with the opposition.

Political and diplomatic sources said US Ambassador David N Merrill yesterday had contacts with Commerce and Information Minister Shamsul Islam and Awami League Presidium member Amir Hossain Amu.

The two leaders are negotiating on behalf of the government and the opposition

Although there was no contact between the two sides, diplomats were active to resume informal talks between the government and the opposition shortly.

Top ROK investor arrives today

A top Korean industrialist arrives in Dhaka today on a week-long visit to discuss ways for further strengthening economic cooperation between the two countries, reports UNB. Kihak Sung, chairman of

Bangladesh-Korean Economic Cooperation, will hold talks with officials of private and public organisations on expansion of bilateral economic cooperation, particularly increase of Korean investment in Bangladesh. He will visit Chittagong to

see the progress of the planned Export Processing Zone (EPZ) at Fauzdarhat exclusively for the Korean investors. About 30 Korean compa-

nies are expected to set up industries in the new EPZ for which about 100 acres of land are being procured.

The EPZ is being set up under an agreement signed between the two countries during Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia's visit to Seoul in May last year.

Kihak Sung is the chairman of a large South Korean industrial complex Youngone.

Implementation of the Uruguay Round Agricultural Agreement (URAA) will make imported farm products costlier with no advantage in exports, affecting the country's agriculture sector in both ways, says a Commerce national market. Ministry study.

now being conducted under the Uruguay Round Study Project of the Ministry. Bangladesh will require to spend an additional Tk 100 crore annually for agricultural imports because this prices will gradually go up.

"The biggest impact the URAA is likely to have is on the agriculture sector of the EC countries. USA. Canada. Australia and Japan which have been subsidizing heavily their domestic agricultural production and exports and protecting this markets from foreign imports," a Commerce Ministry official said quoting the study

"Now, with the implementation of URAA, these countries will reduce subsidy on exports." the official said explaining why agricultural products will gradually become costlier in the inter-The URAA will also open

According to the study. the markets of those countries for agricultural products of other countries but Bangladesh will not be able to utilise those markets as none of its agri-exports are competitive with those of the developed countries.

The study anticipates that the flow of food aid from donor countries will be reduced with a potential adverse impact on the country's development efforts as well as the balance of payment position.
