Barapukuria project Poor logistic support slows down work

The work on the Barapukuria Coal Mine Project may suffer setback due to lack of proper telecommunication facilities, delay in setting up of rail track, absence of Mine Codes and a Mining Training Centre, according to official sources here.

"If necessary measures are not taken immediately, the on-going work might be disrupted," said an official of the Petrobangla. The departments concerned have not vet started work for rail and road links to the project site although funds were sanctioned last year, the Petrobangla official claimed.
