Law Enforcers or Breakers!

Corruption, violence, bribery, human rights violations - people might be forgiven for thinking that we were talking about criminals rather than the police when we use these terms in our conversations. However, they would be wrong in that assumption with reference to many of the "law-enforcing" agencies in Bangladesh today. While recent events have shown us how far things can go wrong, and what we can expect when we expect the worst from the police, the best they can do for us right now isn't too hot either. Whether because of pervasive corruption or general ineptitude. the outlook is not looking bright.

Recently, a relative of mine had her car requisitioned by the police. They did not even bother to send her an official notification regarding the matter, and when she enquired about the reason behind the requisition, she was informed that it was being used for a top-secret crackdown on criminals (because civilian cars made better vehicles for undercover operations; using police cars would give the game away). By the time my intreptd relative finally managed to track down her car three days later, it was to find out that it had been requisitioned for an official who was using it to visit a relative of his in the hospital. As she put it, the worst thing is. if requisitioning cars in this fashion actually led to criminals being apprehended, it would be acceptable; but this kind of misuse is unpardonable!

My colleague's friend was recently flagged down by a policeman on a motorbike. He knew he had not done anything wrong, so he kept on driving. The policeman followed him in disbelief as he drove from Dhanmondi to his house, which was in Mirpur - a twentyminute ride! When he got out of the car, the enraged policeman asked him why he had not stopped at Dhanmondi despite being given the signal to do so. The man smiled amiably and said, "Well, I knew I hadn't done anything, and I thought that if I stopped, you were going to ask me for a "present". I didn't have any money with me, so I thought I would just bring you home with me in order to give you your present!"

If that is the general perception about the police, the ultimate indictment about the bureaucracy and paralysis of the police comes from the young son of a policeman. This policeman is the husband of an acquaintance. His son likes to imitate his father when he is on the telephone, and holds on to an imaginary phone saying, "Sir. Yes, Sir. Yes, Sir. Ji. Sir." As he told his mother proudly, "Ammu, I can do Abbu's job. This is all you have to




