

A young woman committed suicide in the city on Thursday night.

Khurshida Akter, 25, allegedly committed suicide at a residence at Kamrangirchar under Lalbagh thana on Thursday night. Her body was sent to the DMCH morgue for autopsy.

### PCJSS agrees to extend truce till Feb 15

CHITTAGONG, Jan 19: Shantibabini leaders have agreed to extend the ceasefire in Chittagong Hill Tracts until February 15, sources said.

The ongoing truce is due to expire tomorrow.

Earlier the Liaison Committee had proposed for extension of truce till March 31, but Parbatiya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS), parent body of the Shantibabini, declined to it.

The convenor of Liaison Committee, Hongshadon Chakna, on January 12, sent a letter with the appeal to PCJSS and in response to that letter the leaders of Shantibabini on Thursday agreed to extend the truce until February 15.

### Anomaly in promotions in police service

## Rule on govt to show cause

A Division Bench of the High Court has issued a rule upon the government to show cause why a reference for scrutiny and finalisation of a draft gradation list for police officers was withdrawn and promotion given to some prematurely retired army officers allowing ante-dated seniority.

The Rule was issued on January 16 following a writ jointly filed by DIG Dhaka Range AYB1 Siddique and DIG Head Quarters, Nurul Huda before the Division Bench comprising Justice Naimuddin Ahmed and Justice Mohammad Fazul Karim. The rule was issued upon the government through the Secretary of the Ministry of Home Affairs and others, said a press release issued by Barrister Amir-ul-Islam who appeared on behalf of the petitioners.

Barrister Islam had submitted that the Defence Service (fixation of seniority in the civil post) Rules 1983, promulgated under martial law proclamation is a discriminatory law and is violative of equal opportunity in the service of the republic.

Those rules need fresh scrutiny under constitutional

dispensation, Islam had submitted.

It was stated that ignoring a memo from the Public Service Commission (PSC) on November 15 last year for scrutiny and finalisation of a draft gradation list prepared in 1985, promotions were given to the Commissioners of Metropolitan Police, Dhaka and Chittagong to the rank of Additional Inspector General of Police on December 3.

The HC rule asked the government why those entrants should not be declared illegal and without lawful authority.

The petition disclosed that the petitioners, who are now serving as DIG, had joined the police service in 1970 through competitive examinations. They were superseded by 13 prematurely retired army officers in the

## Market capitalisation up, price index down

Market capitalisation and number of share traded in the Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE) showed an upward trend while all share price index declined slightly during the last quarter of 1995.

According to latest quarterly review of the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), market capitalisation rose by 36.22 per cent from Tk 5436.7 crores as of September 30 to Tk 7405.30 crores as of December 31, 1995.

During this period the average daily trading increased by 55.65 per cent from Tk 2.57 crores to Tk 4.11 crores while the share price index decreased by 0.24 per cent to 834.73 as of December 31 from 836.78 on 30th September 1995.

### Opposition urges President

## Send army back to barracks

The three major opposition political parties yesterday called upon President Abdur Rahman Biswas, who is the supreme commander of the armed forces, to withdraw the armed forces and to send them back to the barracks.

"The deadline for recovery of illegal arms is over. Members of the armed forces, deployed throughout the country for this purpose, should now be withdrawn," the three parties resolved at a joint meeting, said Awami League organising secretary Mohammad Nasim.

A fresh agitation programme will be announced tomorrow, said Nasim.

The meeting also urged

the Election Commission to refrain from holding "BNP's one-party blue-print election," and not to be party to its bid to "kill democracy."

It also urged all candidates in the forthcoming elections to withdraw their candidatures before January 23, the last date for withdrawal of candidature.

Abdus Samad Azad, Tofael Ahmed and Mohammad Nasim of AL, Moudud Ahmed and Anwar Hossain Monju of JP and Ali Ahsan Mujahid, Sheikh Ansar Ali and Abdul Quader Mollah of Jamaat attended the meeting.
