DMCH doctors call off strike

Minister assures removal of illegal pharmacies

The doctors of the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) called off their indefinite strike yesterday after the Minister for Health and Family Welfare assured them of removing the unauthorised pharmacies from the hospital premises.

The Minister. Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf, and senior officials of the ministry, during more than an hour long meeting with the striking doctors, also assured that necessary steps would be taken immediately to ensure the security of the doctors at the DMCH and bring the culprits involved in the recent attack on doctors to book.

The DMCH doctors went on strike for an indefinite period Saturday following an alleged attack on doctors on duty by one Dipu, who runs an unauthorised pharmacy in the hospital premises. The doctors came under attack

when they were attending a patient identified as Nasrin who was injured in a road accident. The meeting was held at

the conference hall of the hospital yesterday noon. Later, in the evening the Chikitshak Sangram Parishad, the platform of the striking doctors, in its meeting at the office of the deputy director of the DMCH called off the strike.

The Health Minister during the meeting with the doctors instructed the director of the hospital to take immediate measure to evict all the unauthorised pharmacies at the DMCH premises.
