Options like recruitment by both the official and private agencies and endorsing by a government body for the Malaysia market also came up for discussion in the meet-

ing, the sources said. In fact, officials said, the private agencies have already sent to Malaysia some 3,000 people who were in pipeline when the authorities there suspended recruitment from Bangladesh. The BOESL as the official recruitment agency had endorsed the

consignment.

The deadlock in migration was created when the Malaysian government put an unofficial embargo on recruiting Bangladeshi workers following influx to the newly industrialised country, mainly in first few months of last

After hectic lobbying by

Bangladesh government, Malaysia agreed to resume recruitment from Bangladesh, but only through the government channel, to check illegal entries.

The government authorised the BOESL to send workers to the second largest manpower market for Bangladesh while the Bureau of Manpower, Employment and Training (BMET) was given the task of registering overseas job seekers.

The setback in exporting people from Bangladesh is the second as the country faced a slump in manpower export following the Gulf War in 1990 which also pushed about 63,303 Bangladeshis back from Kuwait and Iraq. two major job markets for Bangladeshi labourers at that

Manpower export also shrank on an average to 15,527 people per month in 1994 from 20,375 the previous year. As a huge number of people went to Malaysia in January and February last year, the export of manpower grew by 2.68 per cent in first 10 months of 1995 over the same period of 1994.

But with the suspension by the Malaysian authorities, Bangladesh's manpower export, along with remittance, slowed down during the first five months of the current

According to Bangladesh Bank statistics, the country earned 485 million US dollar in July-November period of 1995-96 against an income of 483 million dollars during the same period of 1994-95 fiscal.

The earnings would see a further downtrend in coming months unless the government takes emergency measures to explore new manpower markets in Brunei, Singapore, Laos and Taiwan, said a BMET official.
