30 hurt in factory roof collapse

The injured people, most of them, construction work ers, were admitted to the DMCH. Dhaka Orthopedic Hospital, Savar Thana Health Complex. Savar Gonoshasthya Kendro, Joydevpur police said. Rescue teams of the Fire Service and Civil Defence units from the headquarters in Dhaka, Tongi and Gazipur rushed to the spot, fire service sources said

A portion of the roof of the premises collapsed on more than 50 construction workers when they were engaged in their work.
