Jack wants Terry's job

LONDON, Jan 29: Jack Charlton, who resigned last month as the manager of Ireland, said on Sunday he would be willing to replace Terry Venables as the England coach if the Football Association asked him, reports Reuters.

Charlton, 60, a member of England's 1966 World Cup winning team, told the Sunday Express that if the English FA asked for his help, he could not refuse to give it.

"If they came in and said the job is yours if you want it, as an Englishman you would not be able to say no," said Charlton who won 35 England caps.

Under Charlton's guidance, Ireland reached the World Cup finals for the first time in 1990, a feat they repeated in 1994. He also took them to the finals of the European Championships for the first time in 1988.

Venables has said he will quit as England boss after this summer's European Championships because of pressing legal commitments.

Many of his possible replacements have said they are not interested in the job.

Charlton's chances though would also appear to be slight.

When he applied for the vacant England job in the 1980s, the FA never replied to his application.

African Nations' Cup

Tunisia, Ghana thru'to semis



JOHANNESBURG, Jan 29: Tunisia and Ghana, who both had tense uninspiring victories at the African Nations' Cup on Sunday, completed the semifinal line-up, reports AFP.

Tunisia beat Gabon 4-1 on penalties in Durban after being deadlocked at 1-1 following extra time, and Ghana edged out a very physical Zaire 1-0 at Port Elizabeth.

Tunisia, who carry North African hopes following quarterfinal defeats for both Egypt and Algeria, now face Zambia in Wednesday afternoon's semifinal in Durban. Ghana meet hosts South Africa at Johannesburg on Wednesday evening.

Ghana have doubts over the fitness of captain Abedi Pele, who twisted his ankle during the last 10 minutes, although Brazilian coach Ismail Kurtz was optimistic he would recover.

Neither match was a classic in footballing terms, but both were memorable as hard-fought battles.

Anthony Yeboah scored the winner as Ghana edged out 10-man Zaire, who seemed determined to kick Ghana off the pitch.

But the Leeds United striker had the last laugh following his 23rd minute goal, shortly after defender Nzele Lombi was sent off in a culmination of Zaire's rough-house tactics.

Lombi headed a ball near the centre circle and as he came down he kicked Pele with a "kung-fu" style in the back and was immediately dismissed.

Lombi's dismissal was the third of the tournament after Burkina Faso defender Hassane Kamagate and Mozambique keeper Rui Alves.

Mallam Yahaya floated the ball into the box, and Pele got to the by-line before cutting the ball back. Yeboah darted into the six-yard box and, at full-stretch, just got his left foot to the ball to guide it home.

Meanwhile it was Tunisian keeper Chokri El Ouaer who performed late heroics as they beat Gabon 4-1 on penalties.

The match ended 1-1 after extra time with Tunisia's Zoubair Beya scoring first before Gabon's Brice Mackaya equalised from a freekick.

El Ouaer saved the first two Gabon penalties before scoring the winning kick himself with a low shot the left of Gabon keeper Germain Mendome.

In the first half, Mehdi Slimane wrongfooted a defender on the right side of the box, before crossing to Beya in the 10th minute. Beya then shot into the top right-hand corner past keeper Mendome, who got a slight touch.

With the Tunisian wall disorganised, Mackaya shot through the gap with the outside of his left boot past Chokri for the equaliser.

The result helped make up for Tunisia's disappointment on home soil two years ago when they lost in their group.

Tunisia are one match away from at least equaling their best previous performance of second spot in 1965.

Europe in the doldrums

LONDON, Jan 29: George Weah didn't make it back from the African championships for AC Milan Sunday but Roberto Baggio made up for his absence, reports AP.

The star forward set up both goals as Milan rolled to a 2-0 victory at Udinese to move three points clear atop the Italian league standings.

Baggio's corner gave Paolo Maldini the chance to put Milan ahead in the final minutes of the first half. And his carefully measured pass to Zvonimir Boban enabled the Croatian to score from close range in the 58th.

Milan had hoped that Weah, Europe's player-of-the-year for 1995, would make it back for the game after his Liberian team had been eliminated from the African Nations' Cup in South Africa.

Florentina, second in the Serie A standings, squandered a chance of keeping Milan's lead down to one point when they were held 1-1 at home by modest Vicenza.

Argentine striker Gabriel Batistuta's 14th goal — tying him with Bari's Igor Protti for the league lead — had put Fiorentina ahead in the eighth minute. But Vicenza's veteran midfielder Domenico Di Carlo scored his first Serie A to tie the game two minutes into the second half.

Parma missed a chance of taking over second place when a late Inter Milan goal by Marco Branca tied the game at 1-1 at San Siro.

Bulgarian striker Hristo Stoichkov outpaced the Inter defence to fire Parma ahead after five minutes. But Branca atoned for earlier misses by heading home a centre by the impressive Benito Carbone seven minutes from the end.

Pierluigi Casiraghi scored three first half goals for Lazio in a 4-0 beating of Cagliari in Rome's Olympic stadium while defending champion Juventus downed Piacenza 2-0 with goals from Antonio Conte and defender Ciro Ferrara.

Away at Spain, Atletico Madrid extended their lead to nine points by beating Athletic de Bilbao 4-1 Sunday.

Bulgarian Lugoslav Penev netted his seventh penalty of the season for one of the Atletico goals while others came from Francisco "Kiko" Narvaez, Yugoslav midfielder Milinko Pantic and Leonardo Angel Blaginf.

Ivan de la Pena scored twice as Barcelona jumped one place into second after beating Real Zaragoza 3-1 in Camp Nou stadium. Second place Espanol could only tie 0-0 with Albacete and fourth place Compostela lost more ground on leader Atletico Madrid by losing at home for the first time, 3-1 to Valladolid.

Compostela slipped to fifth behind Valencia who overpowered Merida 4-1 with Montenegrin midfielder Predrag Mijatovic scoring twice.

Real Madrid's first game under the guidance of new

coach Arsenio Iglesias ended in a 2-1 victory at Oviedo.

Raul Gonzalez scored the two goals and Real held on even though Luis Enrique Martinez was sent off nine minutes before half time.

In the French league, Patrice Loko fired two goals for Paris Saint-Germain in a 2-1 victory over Cannes in front of 33,000 fans before Laurent Charvet replied 10 minutes from the end for the visitors Saturday.

The victory opened up a lead of six points for PSG as second place Metz was unable to play its game against Lyon because of bad weather.

Auxerre jumped into second place ahead of Metz by edging Le Havre 1-0 thanks to a goal by newly-capped Sabri Lamouchi.

In Portugal, FC Porto gained a 3-2 victory at Chaves to open an 11-point lead atop the standings but Sporting Lisbon fired coach Carlos Queiroz after suffering its third defeat in as many weeks Sunday.

Sporting lost 1-0 at home to a modest Braga Sunday and fell from second to fourth place in the first division standings. Midfielder Pedro Estrela scored the winning goal in the 82nd minute.

Boavista, which was locked in a three-way tie for second with Sporting and Benfica before the weekend's 20th round games, could only muster a 1-1 draw at Gil Vi-

cente and slipped to third place.

Benfica is second after its 4-2 victory at Guimaraes Saturday.

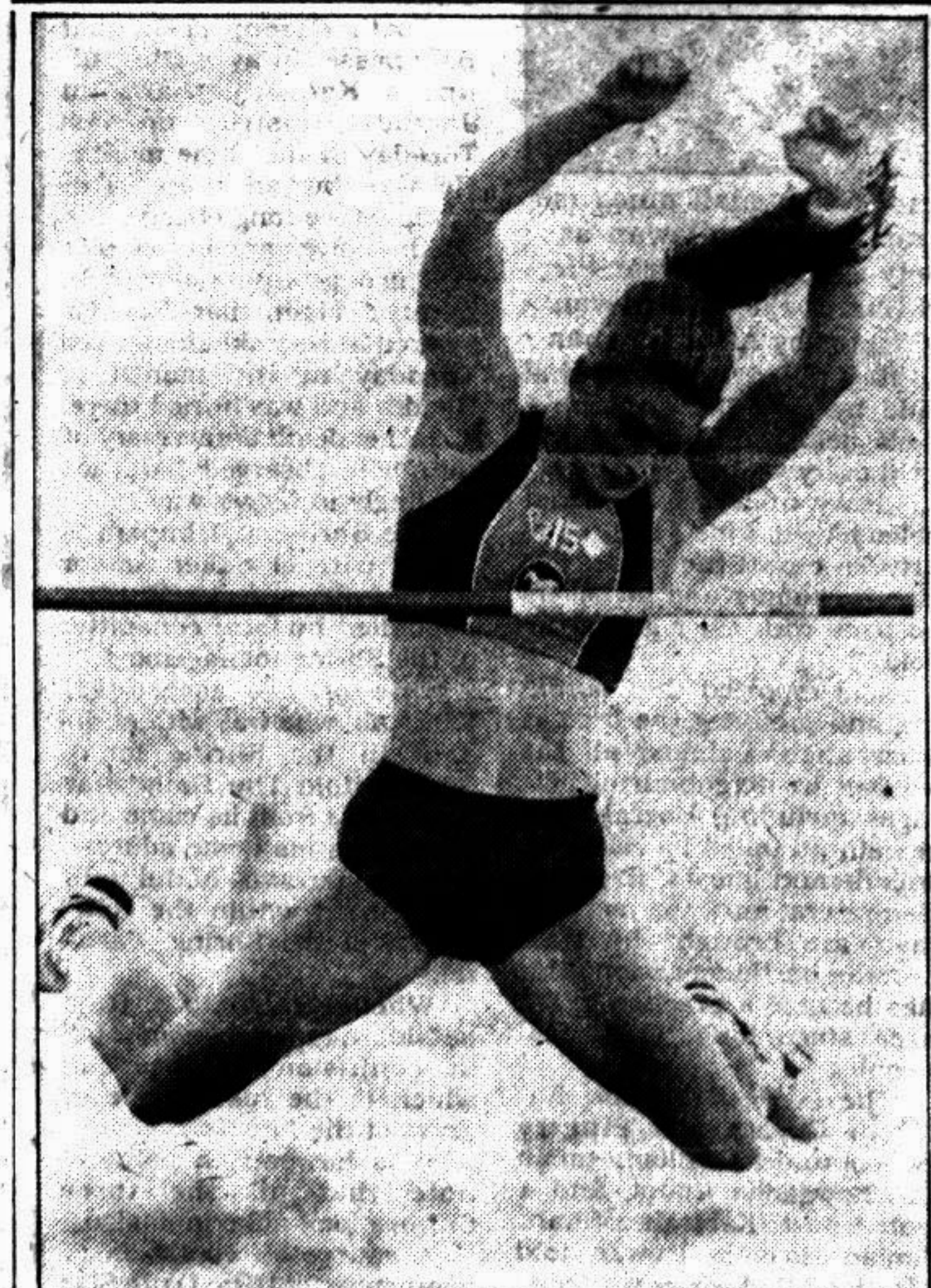
In the English FA Cup, Tottenham striker Dwight Yorke struck for Aston Villa for the only goal of the game against Sheffield United Sunday as Serbian striker Savo Milosevic had been upended by Irish international goalkeeper Alan Kelly in the 62nd minute at Bramall Lane.

A deflected 25-yard shot by Ian Bogie flew past veteran Everton goalkeeper Neville Southall as Division one Port Vale gained a 2-2 tie at the home of the defending titlist Saturday.

Vale's Martin Foyle cancelled out a goal for Everton by Nigerian striker Daniel Amokachi. Two minutes from the end, Everton's Scottish striker Duncan Ferguson netted from close range after Vale goalkeeper Paul Musshellwhite had dropped a cross from Anders Limpar. But the visitors hit back again for a second equalizer from Bogie.

But Don Goodman replied to force a 1-1 tie and a replay.

But Manchester United, another eight time Cup champion, romped to a 3-0 victory at division one Reading in a game marred by an injury to a linesman, who was struck close to his left eye by a coin thrown by a fan.

Premier cricket resumes today

The Premier Division cricket league resumes today after a day's unscheduled recess with joint holders Abahani Krira Chakra taking on fellow title aspirants Bangladesh Biman in a crucial match at the Dhaka Stadium.

Although both have already confirmed their places in the six-team super league along with leaders Mohammedan Sporting Club, Brothers Union and Kalabagan Krira Chakra, the match bears special significance as the loser will fall behind further in the title chase.

Both Abahani and Bijoy Dibosh victors Biman have collected 14 points each from their nine league engagements, two behind Mohammedans who take on Kalabagan tomorrow.

The last member of the elite super league will be decided when Greater Myensingh Cricket Club (GMCC) take on Wari Club on February 2. Both have five wins to their credit out of ten matches played.

Meanwhile, the much awaited match between Abahani and Mohammedans, the two most popular outfits of the country, has been rescheduled to February 3 as per the revised fixture made public yesterday.

The last match of the first phase of the league will be completed on February 4. However, the super league and the relegation league are expected to begin after Eid due to a fortnight-long visit by an MCC eleven to Dhaka. The English side are scheduled to arrive on February 2.

Fantastic Emma

PERTH, Jan 29: Australian Emma George set two world records in the space of five minutes in the women's pole vault at a Grand Prix athletics meeting here late Sunday, reports AFP.

Fresh from her world record vault of 4.28 metres at the Perry Lake Stadium here last month, 21-year-old George cleared 4.30m without problems and then lifted the bar to 4.41m.

Gorge experienced little difficulty with that bid before she quit after missing her first attempt at 4.50m.

George's effort in successfully negotiating above 4.40m was important.

Last year Germany's Andrea Mueller cleared 4.30 in an exhibition in a town square, and the leap wasn't recognised as a world record.

George broke the women's pole vault world record twice in as many weeks late last year in Melbourne and Perth.

She originally bettered the existing mark of 4.23m by China's Sun Caiyun to 4.25m in Melbourne on November 30 and then increased it to 4.28m in Perth a week before Christmas.

It is the 19th time the women's pole vault world record has been bettered. The women's pole vault is a non-Olympic event.

Aussies amerce Lankans



ADELAIDE, Jan 29: All-rounder Steve Waugh deplored Sri Lanka's despondency at the end of a troubled tour by steering Australia to a crushing win in the third and final Test today, reports Reuters.

Waugh claimed four crucial wickets as the tourists lost their last eight batsmen for 57 runs to sink to defeat by 148 runs at the Adelaide Oval.

Chasing a daunting victory target of 401, Sri Lanka were dismissed for 252 in 96.2 overs in their second innings, tumbling to their third successive heavy loss against Mark Taylor's side.

Sri Lanka, whose tour has been beset with controversy since their arrival in mid-November, finally succumbed during the final session after resisting tenaciously earlier in the day.

Australia's veteran number three batsman David Boon, playing his 107th and final Test match before retiring, was hugged by jubilant teammates at the end of the game.

Sri Lanka opener Sanath Jayasuriya earlier raised his hopes of salvaging a draw with his maiden Test century before losing his wicket to Waugh's medium pace.

Jayasuriya departed for 112 after edging a catch to wicketkeeper Ian Healy to leave Sri Lanka on 195 for

three midway through the afternoon session.

Although the third Test lacked the controversy of the earlier encounters in Perth and Melbourne, Australia proved equally dominant.

Waugh, who scored a century and an unbeaten half-century earlier in the match, also broke the resistance of Sanjeewa Ranatunga for 65 in his first over after tea.

Bowling for the first time in the series after suffering a succession of injuries, Waugh added to his tally with the wickets of wicketkeeper Ramesh Kaluwitharana for nought and off-spinner Dhamasena for two.

Waugh finished with figures of four for 34 from 19 overs, while fast bowler Glenn McGrath contributed three for 48.

Resuming on 69 for one, Sri Lanka defied Australia before lunch when Jayasuriya and Ranatunga, skipper brother of injured youngster Arjuna combined in a tenacious third-wicket partnership worth 125 runs.

Jayasuriya, who started the day on 50, shed his natural exuberance today during an innings lasting four-and-a-half hours.

The left-hander hit two sixes and 14 fours, carving into the attack during the final session on Sunday before, adopting a more circumspect and patient approach on the final day.

Australia, who scored a formidable 502 for nine declared, set Sri Lanka a target after Australia captain Taylor declared the second innings at 215 for six on Sunday.

Sri Lanka scored 317 all out in their first innings to avoid the follow-on.

The first Test between the two countries was marred when Sri Lanka were found guilty and then exonerated of ball-tampering.

Sri Lanka off-spinner Muttiah Muralitharan was no-balled for throwing during the second Test in Melbourne, overshadowing a second and successive crushing victory by Australia.

Steve Waugh completed a brilliant summer, scoring three centuries in five Tests. He won the awards for both

man-of-the-match and man-of-the-series.

LONDON, Jan 29: Ian Bogie's deflected shot a minute from the end earned division one strugglers Port Vale a 2-2 tie, reports AP.

A minute before Bogie's strike, Vale goalkeeper Paul Musshellwhite dropped a cross by Everton's Swedish winger Anders Limpar at the feet of Duncan Ferguson and the Scottish strike made no mistake from close range.

The Everton fans were still celebrating when Bogie shot at goal from 25 yards and the ball took a deflection before swerving past the home team's veteran Welsh international goalkeeper Neville Southall.

Earlier, Nigerian striker Daniel Amokachi had headed Everton in front four minutes before half time and Martin Foyle had leveled for Vale in the 59th.

Only three of the 13 scheduled Cup games were played because of icy weather which swept across Britain and forced cancellation of most games.

Manchester United, who lost to Everton in last season's final when they failed to win the trophy for a record ninth time, is the only team definitely in the fifth round after scoring a comfortable 3-0 victory at division one Reading.

But Tottenham, another eight-time cup titlist, need a tricky replay at division one Wolves after being held 1-1 at home.

In the only league game, Millwall were held 1-1 at home by Portsmouth.

In Scotland, mighty Rangers crushed the semi-pro players of Keith 10-1 in the third round of the cup. Only five of the 14 Scottish Cup games were played because of the weather.

Reading's Trevor Morley missed two easy chances before Ryan Giggs fired Manchester United in the 36th minute at Eln Park after Lee Sharpe's shot had been blocked by goalkeeper Nicky Hammond.

Paul Parker, cautioned within a minute of entering the game in the 54th minute, scored a minute later for his first of the season when Hammond misjudged his mis-hit center.

United's Danish goalkeeper, Peter Schmeichel, saved from Lee Nogan but Reds' defender Steve Bruce missed from close range.

Dalby rules the pool

ESPOO, Finland, Jan 29: Norway's Irene Dalby on Sunday swept to victory in the 400 metres freestyle to complete a triple triumph on the second day of a World Cup swimming meeting, reports BSS.

Dalby, who won double gold at the 1991 European Championships but managed only two bronzes in last year's competition, clocked four minutes 12.47 seconds to win the 400 metres, some eight seconds clear of the Czech Republic's Jana Pechanova.

On Saturday, Dalby beat Pechanova by nearly 17 seconds to win the 800 metres in 8:36.63. She earlier edged home in front of Poland's Hana Cerna to win the 200 metres in 2:01.13.
