There was total absence of monitoring, the official said. The severe crisis of fertilizer last year sparked a nationwide violent protest in which some farmers were report-

edly killed in police firing. There is now a ready stock of about 28,000 metric tons of fertilizer in the buffer stock in godowns of Jamuna Fertilizer Factory. This stock is reasonably satisfactory and enough to meet the requirements upto mid-February.

But the problems remains in distribution channel as most of the dealers sold their fertilizer at the mills gate at prices upto Tk. 230 a 50 kilogram (kg) bag against the official price of Tk. 18650.

bagging some windfall profits. BCIC officials admitted such sales, but said they had nothing to do as such deals take place outside the mills. Dealers do such dealings because their security money of Taka 2 lakh will be seized if they fail to lift in time the fertilizer allotted to them.

It is also because the numbers of dealers in the district where the Jamuna fertilizer factory is located are unusually high, and the dealers with small capital sell their quarter to the big ones.

On the other hand, a large number of rickshaws, both from Cox's Bazar pourashava and adjacent unions, are reportedly plying in the pourashava without any li-

The busy commercial town has become a place of rickshaws much to the annoyance and sufferings of the people, local people complained, urging the authorities to take immediate steps in this regard.
