The total DRG availability from Japan from 1979 to June 1995 was estimated at about 1,10,156 million Yen (1101 million US dollars). Till the last fiscal year (1994-'95), the cumulitative Japanese aid to

Bangladesh stood at about During the last financial year, Japan had committed 590 million US dollars to Bangladesh.
