**UNAB**

United Nations Association of Bangladesh (UNAB) on Saturday organised a discussion meeting on "Celebration of 50th Anniversary of the United Nations in Bangladesh in 1995: A General Review" at its office in the city, says a press release.

Professor Muhammad Abu Bakar presided over the meeting while poet Santosh Gupta, Prof. Abdus Selim, Mollah Mokbul Hossain, Dr Syed Mohammad Shahed, Prof. Raisuddin and Syed Ahmed, secretary-general, UNAB took part in the discussion.

The speakers opined that Bangladesh took befitting programmes to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the UN where in Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Government of Bangladesh played an important role. In this regard they praised the pioneering role played by the United Nations Association of Bangladesh.

The speakers also referred to the close relationship that Bangladesh has ever since its emergence with the UN and its cooperation extended to Bangladesh.

**Liberty int'l**

Liberty International, an international human rights organisation, yesterday expressed concern over the escalation of human rights violations in the country, reports UNB.

The Liberty International said "Apart from carrying out enquiries and punishing those responsible for serious human rights violations, the pacification and normalisation of politics are prerequisites to reverse this situation."

The organisation urged all, including the government and political parties and law enforcing agencies, to protect human rights.

**JCD rally at DU**

The Jatityatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) brought out a procession on the campus and held a rally at the Aparajeo Bangla yesterday.

JCD leaders held the Dhaka University Teachers' Association (DUTA) responsible for the deteriorating environment of the university.

The rally was addressed by Muniruzzaman Monir, Shahiduddin Chowdhury Anney, A B M Mosharraf Hossain, Monir Hossain and Nasiruddin Pintu.

The JCD leaders alleged that DUTA, not BCL had made the situation of the campus volatile. They accused the president and secretary of the DUTA for acting at the direction of Sheikh Hasina.

They blamed BCL for Saturday's gunfight on the campus. The JCD leaders said the BCL in association with the Chhatra Samaj (student wing of the Jatitya Party) created panic on the campus by firing indiscriminately.

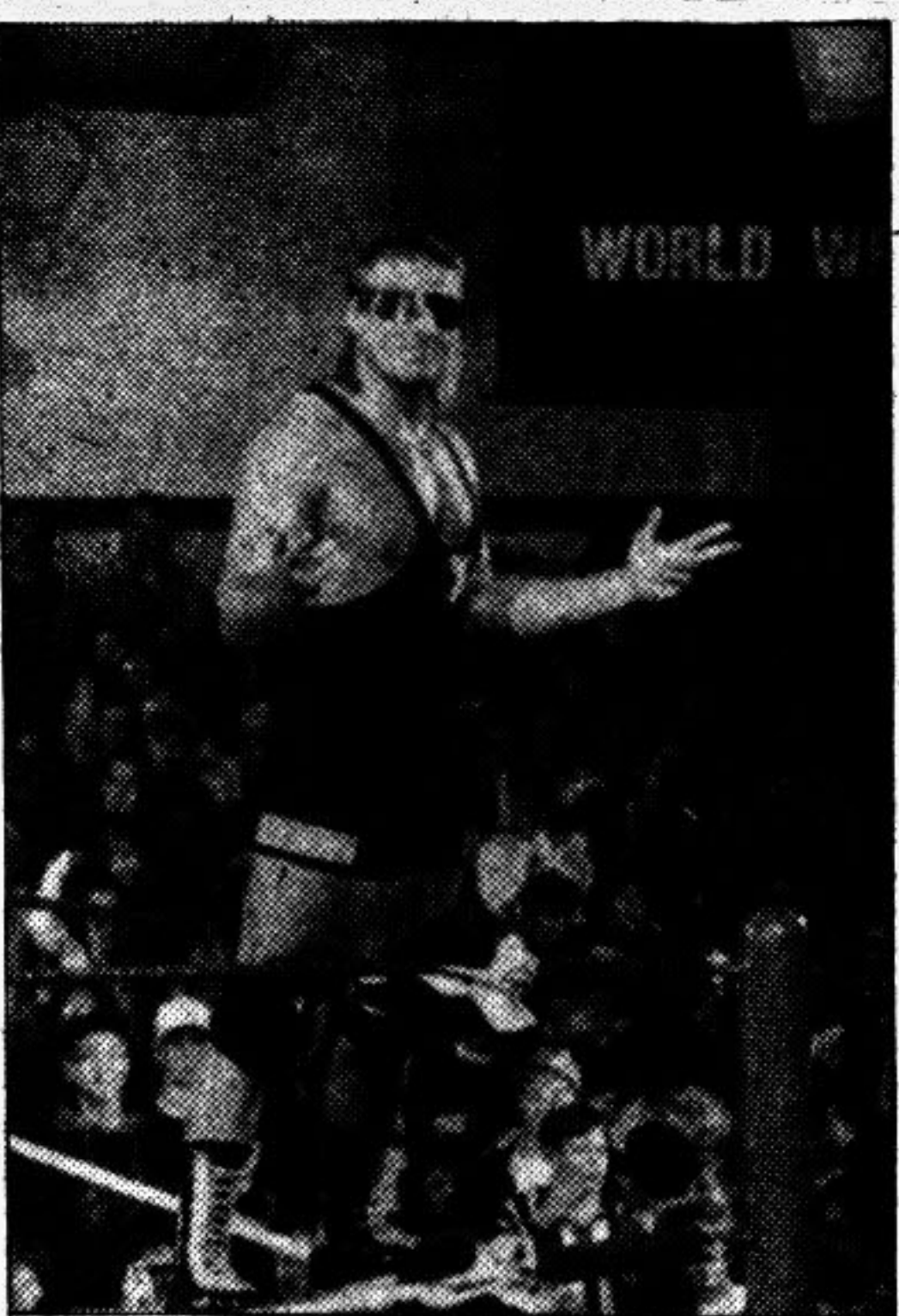
